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REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

FOR THE PERIOD 1ST JANUARY 2006 TO 31ST MARCH 2007

The Directors have pleasure in submitting their annual report together with the accounts for the 15 month financial period ended 31st March 2007.

Principal objects

The principal objects of the company are to promote educational opportunity, social responsibility and multicultural awareness amongst children and young people.

Policies to further the charity's objects

The income and property of the charity from whatever source derived are applied solely towards the promotion of its objects as set out above. No portion thereof is paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit to the members of the company.

Review of activities and future developments

This year ReachOut Youth began its twelfth year of activities. Mentoring provision in Manchester, London and Glasgow continued to grow.

MANCHESTER

In School Mentoring

Mentoring in primary schools in Wythenshawe, Hulme and Moss Side continued as in previous years with a total of 70 mentoring relationships set up during the year. As last year the schools where mentoring took place were as follows:

- St Mary's C.E. Primary School, Moss Side
- St Wilfrid's R.C. Primary School, Hulme
- St John Fisher & St Thomas More R.C. Primary School, Benchill
- And we started at a new school;
- Bishop Bilsborrow R.C Primary School, Moss Side

We hope to start at a new school in September 2007, namely Harpur Mount Primary School in Harpurhey.

Continued funding from Manchester Connexions enabled us to further develop the project in Higher Blackley with secondary school pupils who were at risk of exclusion or of dropping out from school altogether with a view to ensuring that the pupils continued in education, became volunteers or entered further training or found employment. The schools involved were:

- Plant Hill High School, Higher Blackley
- Our Lady's Sports College, Higher Blackley

Feedback from both schools was very positive and a number of young people took up further education or training following the mentoring support. In total 22 young high school students received such support (a modest decrease on the previous year when 23 received support).

We also successfully commenced working at Parklands High School in Wythenshawe running two pilot projects with 6 mentors and an average of 8 young people attending an after school club and a guided reading project. These are still in their infancy but the prospects are encouraging and we are receiving good support from the school.

Youth Centre Mentoring

Mentoring continued in the Millennium Powerhouse in Moss Side, with 12 Volunteers (22 in the previous year) and 36 (13 regulars) children took part in the activities in these centres. It was not possible to continue in the Procter Centre.

Partnership Mentoring

During the year we continued with 3 mentoring projects in partnership with other organisations, Making It Work Partnership (Barnardo's, Black Health Agency, Manchester Youth Volunteering Project and ReachOut!) Chrysalis and Woodhouse Park Family Centre. A total of 12 mentors provided support to young people.

LONDON

The projects in Hackney, London went from strength to strength with continued support from the Neighbourhood Renewal Fund and Hackney Borough Council.

This growth meant we had achieved the increase in capacity we had planned for in the previous year. There was another successful Boys Summer Programme in 2006, supported by generous funding from The Mercers Company, and a further Boys Summer Programme in '006 which i eccived very positive feedback from mentors, mentees, parents, teachers, Nicola Baboneau, Assistant Director Children's Services at the Learning Trust, and Councillors Carol Williams and Afolosade Bright.

We continued to build on the success of the previous year with mentoring continuing in the following schools through the Midweek Mentoring Programme;

- De Beauvoir Primary
- Jubilee Primary

The plans of the previous year to expand the programme to other schools during the week and set up a youth centre type activity at weekends came to fruition when we expanded into;

- Colvestone Primary
- Brook Community Primary
- Shacklewell Primary

and the Soccer School restarted at B6 College in Hackney, with three sessions every Saturday catering for up to 60 young people a week.

A total of 80 mentoring relationships (40 boys, 40 girls) had been established by the end of December 2006.

ReachOut! London also started its first service in Tower Hamlets, running 3 Midweek Mentoring Programmes in 2006-07 (two girls, one boys). A total of 30 mentoring partnerships were established and the programme has again received very positive feedback from all parties involved.

GLASGOW

The position in Glasgow remained largely as it had been in the previous year. Mentoring continued, with another small increase in members in Sighthill. The project is still headed by

Gerry McCarthy and is totally managed and staffed by volunteers which makes progress difficult but their commitment remains outstanding.

Training

We continued to develop our in house training programme designed to help mentors to understand the nature of the ReachOut! Mentoring Programme.

We continued with our partnership with Manchester College of Art and Technology (MANCAT). We ran two OCN courses in Mentoring, again delivered by Mandy Johnson of MANCAT. Mark Clayton of Capturing Passion provided further training in goal setting for both mentor and mentees.

Funding

During the period we secured or maintained our main funding from the following institutions:
- BBC Children in Need Appeal; Lloyds TSB Foundation, Connexions, Neighbourhood Renewal Fund and Manchester Children's Fund (until September 2006)

We continued with our fund raising projects including the Annual Sponsored Cycle ride, postponed from the previous year, which started in Glasgow and finished at John o'Groats. The number of private individuals providing regular funding support to ReachOut continues to grow and we warmly thank those individuals for their generosity.

Recruitment

We welcomed our new recruitment manager, Stephen Barrie, who played a major role in the progress we made during the course of the year, especially in Higher Blackley and in dealing with the logistics of CRB checks and social events and in initial monitoring and evaluation of the projects.

David Bowers joined us in October 2006 and was instrumental in developing links with the African Caribbean Society at Manchester University and MMU and with the Somali Community. He also provided the impetus for the Parklands project.

As in previous years student volunteers were recruited from the University of Manchester and from Manchester Metropolitan University. St Bede's College provided volunteers from among local 6th form students.

In London volunteers were recruited from University of London Colleges and sixth Form Colleges in Hackney

Future Plans

Our plans for 2007 and the forthcoming months as in previous years are to learn from our experiences, build on what we have and consolidate on the achievements to date. We hope to We will continue to work towards improving the way we evaluate the work we do so as to ensure that the service we provide reflects the needs of the local communities in which we work and to ensure that the training we provide to our volunteers fits them for the job we ask them to do. In order to improve our evaluation methods we will continue to work closely with our funders and seek additional help and advice where necessary.

Reserves policy and risk management

The directors are mindful of the need to build up reserves to enable the charity to continue in operation in the event that a major source of funding is lost or unplanned expenditure should arise. At 31st March 2007 unrestricted reserves total £29,508, this together with commitments for funding from Government and other institutions is sufficient in the directors opinion to meet six months running costs whilst still applying funds to achieve the main objects of the charity.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE PERIOD 1ST JANUARY 2006 TO 31ST MARCH 2007

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice -Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2000), applicable UK Accounting Standards and the Companies Act 1985. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are as set out below.

b) Company Status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are drawn from various walks of life, all with experiences valuable to the work of the company. In the event of the company being would up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £10 per member of the charity.

c) Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income, there is certainty of receipt and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Grants are receivable and local authority fees are credited to the SOFA in the period for which they are received. Deferred income represents amounts received for future periods and is released to incoming Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

d) Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

e) Irrecoverable VAT

All resources expended are classified under activity headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of resources expended for which it was incurred.

f) Operating leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases are charged to the SOFA over the period in which the cost is incurred.

g) Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation has been provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over it's expected useful life as follows:

Fixtures & Equipment 33% straight line.

Motor Vehicles

33% straight line.

h) Fund accounting

- Unrestricted funds comprise accumulated surpluses and deficits on general funds that are available for use at the discretion of the trustees/directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity and that have not been designated for other purposes.
- Restricted funds are funds subject to restrictions imposed by the donor or by the specific terms of the appeal under which the funds are raised.
- Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been put aside at the discretion of the trustees/directors for particular purposes.
