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REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors present their annual report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2010

Principal activity

The Group is principally engaged in the supply of catering services. The principal activity of the Company is that of a holding company providing management services to its subsidiaries.

Business review and future developments

The results of the Group are shown on page 8 The Directors have not recommended a dividend

Whilst trading conditions were difficult during the year due to the economic climate and other factors, the Directors are pleased to report, following a reorganisation of the Group, that current projections indicate an expected improvement in the profitability of the Group for the year to 30 April 2011. Whilst the Directors believe these projections to be reasonable, they make certain assumptions that may be influenced by circumstances or events beyond the control of the Directors and are thus subject to change.

The Directors consider the key performance indicators of the Group to be turnover and profit by contract The Directors are satisfied with the performance of the Group under these measures

Financial risk management objectives and policies

The Group's principal financial instruments comprise loan notes, preference shares, cash and short-term deposits. The main purpose of these financial instruments is to raise finance for the Group's operations. The Group has various other financial instruments such as trade debtors and trade creditors, which arise directly from its operations. The Group does not enter into derivative transactions.

It is, and has been throughout the period under review, the Group's policy that no trading in financial instruments shall be undertaken. The main risks arising from the Group's financial instruments are liquidity risk, interest rate risk and credit risk. The board reviews and agrees policies for managing each of these risks and they are summarised below.

Liquidity risk

The Group has a high level of debt and cashflow has historically been tight. As a consequence the Board of Directors continually review the facilities available to the Group and seeks to manage financial risk by ensuring sufficient liquidity is available to meet foreseeable needs and to invest cash assets safely and profitably

Interest rate risk

The Group incurs significant interest costs as a result of its high levels of borrowing which are managed by the use of fixed rates of interest. Where the Group has cash deposits the rate of interest received on these deposits is regularly reviewed to ensure the most favourable rate of return is achieved.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

Credit risk

The Group trades with only recognised, creditworthy third parties. It is the Group policy that all significant customers who wish to trade on credit terms are subject to credit vetting procedures. In addition, receivable balances are monitored on an ongoing basis with the result that the Group's exposure to bad debts is not significant.

Directors' responsibilities

The Directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and the Group and of the profit or loss of the Group for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Directors are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- state whether applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Group will continue in business

The Directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Group and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Group and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards The principal accounting policies of the Group are set out below

GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the Directors have prepared cashflow forecasts for 12 months from the date of signing these financial statements, which make certain assumptions regarding trading. On the basis of these assumptions the forecasts demonstrate that the Group has sufficient finance facilities available to allow it to continue in business for the foreseeable future. The directors will continue to support the business in the unlikely event of a cash shortfall during the twelve months following the signing of the financial statements.

On 11 November 2010 the entire ordinary, 'A' ordinary and deferred ordinary share capital, together with the deferred share capital was sold to Graysons Hospitality Associates Limited (formerly Food RN Limited) As part of this transaction Dunedin (Sage GP) Nominees Limited waived £4,169,992 A Loan notes and B Loan notes, together with the associated accrued interest of £478,132 The £200,000 preference shares were also waived, together with the associated accrued dividends of £100,334 This waiver has strengthened the Group balance sheet at 30 April 2010, as shown in note 25

PRIOR YEAR ADJUSTMENT

A prior year adjustment has been made in respect of the defined contribution pension scheme deficit as disclosed in note 22. The contributions to the scheme had previously been treated as contributions to the multi employer East Sussex Pension Fund, from which the assets and liabilities relating to the Group's employees could not be separately identified. During the year ended 30 April 2010, it has been discovered that the assets and liabilities of the East Sussex Pension Fund relating to the Group can be identified. The financial statements have been adjusted to treat the scheme as a defined benefits scheme, therefore representing a change of accounting policy. The effect of recognising the defined contribution pension deficit on the Group for the year ended 30 April 2009 is set out in the table below.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF CONSOLIDATION

The Group financial statements consolidate those of the Company and of its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to 30 April 2010 The Company has taken advantage of the exemption available under section 408 of the Companies Act 2006 to omit its own profit and loss account from the statutory Group accounts

Accounting policies are applied consistently across the Group

Acquisitions of subsidiaries are dealt with by the acquisition method of accounting

GOODWILL

Goodwill arising on consolidation, representing the excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair value of the identifiable net assets acquired, is capitalised and amortised over its useful economic life

Purchased goodwill is capitalised and is amortised on a straight line basis over its estimated useful economic life

Goodwill is reviewed for impairment at the end of the first full financial year following the acquisition and in other periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable

TURNOVER

Turnover represents the total value, excluding VAT, of goods supplied and services provided and is recognised on delivery of the service. Deposits received in connection with catering events to be held at a later date are deferred until the event has taken place.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation and any required impairment

Depreciation is calculated to write down the cost less estimated residual value of all tangible fixed assets by annual instalments over their expected useful economic lives. The rates generally applicable are

Leasehold property

Computer and office equipment

Plant, equipment, fixtures and fittings

Over the life of the lease

5 years or over the life of the contract for which the assets

are purchased

INTANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Licences are included at cost and amortised on a straight line basis over the life of the contract for which the licences are purchased

STOCKS

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items

LEASED ASSETS

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

DEFERRED TAXATION

Deferred tax is recognised on all timing differences where the transactions or events that give the Group an obligation to pay more tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future, have occurred by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised when it is more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax is measured using rates of tax that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

PENSIONS

Defined Contribution Pension Scheme

The Group operates a defined contribution pension scheme for certain employees The assets of the pension scheme are held separately from those of the Group in independently administered funds. The annual contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account

Defined benefit pension scheme

The Group also has a defined benefit pension scheme for certain employees of a subsidiary undertaking. Scheme assets are measured at fair values. Scheme liabilities are measured on an actuarial basis using the projected unit method and are discounted at appropriate high quality corporate bond rates. The net surplus or deficit, adjusted for deferred tax, is presented separately from other net assets on the balance sheet. A net surplus is recognised only to the extent that is recoverable by the Group through reduced contributions or a repayment.

The current service cost and costs from settlements and curtailments are charged against operating profit Post service costs are spread over the period until the benefit increases vest. Interest on the scheme liabilities and the expected return on scheme assets are included net in interest costs. Actuarial gains and losses are reported in the statement of total recognised gains and losses.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

Where the contractual obligations of financial instruments (including share capital) are equivalent to a similar debt instrument, those financial instruments are classed as financial liabilities. Financial liabilities are presented as such in the balance sheet. Finance costs and gains or losses relating to financial liabilities are included in the profit and loss account. Finance costs are calculated so as to produce a constant rate of return on the outstanding liability.

Where the contractual terms of share capital do not have any terms meeting the definition of a financial liability then this is classed as an equity instrument. Dividends and distributions relating to equity instruments are debited direct to equity

Preference shares

The preference shares carry an entitlement to a fixed cumulative preferred cash dividend at the rate of 7% per share per annum on the aggregate subscription price of £1 in priority to the payment of any other dividend of the Company. The first payment of the preference dividend shall be paid not more than four months after the end of each financial year commencing with the financial year ended 30 April 2005. No preference dividend has been paid up to 30 April 2010 due to the losses incurred by the Company.

In accordance with FRS 25 the preference shares have been classed as a liability as they are irredeemable and on a liquidation, winding up or any other return of capital, in priority to the rights of the holders of any other class of shares, each preference shareholder will be paid first an amount equal to the aggregate subscription price and second an amount equal to any accrued but unpaid preference dividend

Preference shareholders shall be entitled to receive notice of and to attend and speak, but not vote, at general meetings of the Company

Loan notes

The £1,300,000 A loan notes 2004 and £3,467,000 B loan notes 2010 are secured and carry interest at fixed rates of 10%. The 2004 loan notes were originally redeemable at par on 31 August 2004 but the lender agreed to extend repayment until 31 January 2006 together with rolled up interest on these loan notes amounting to £273,534. The 2010 loan notes are redeemable in fixed proportions commencing 31 July 2007 and ending 31 July 2010.

On 26 June 2009 £240,543 of the A loan notes 2004, and all of the rolled up interest on the A loan notes 2004 and the B loan notes 2010 up to 28 February 2009 amounting to £3,235,165, were converted into £3,475,708 deferred ordinary shares in the Company, as shown in note 13 The interest payable from 1 March 2009 on the principal amount of the A loan notes 2004 and the B loan notes 2010 is at a rate of 10% per annum

On 16 November 2010 additional £370,000 Fixed Rate Guaranteed Loan Notes 2010 were issued. These loan notes are secured and carry a fixed interest rate of 10%
