Incorporation

The company was incorporated on 4th February 2003 as Boxwall Limited. It changed it's name to Childrens Hospitals Appeal Trust Limited on 10 April 2003. On 7th June 2004 it changed it's name to MedEquip4Kids Limited.

Constitution, Objects and policies

The charitable trust is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and is therefore governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

The objects of the charity are to promote:

- the relief of sickness and the preservation and protection of the health of children and young people by the provision of equipment and amenities to aid their recovery at all Childrens' Hospitals & Units.
- research into sickness among children and young people and to disseminate and publish the useful results for the benefit of the public.

In the furtherance of these charitable objects, the charity is to raise funds and invite and receive from any person or persons whatsoever by way of subscription, donation & otherwise, provided that the charity does not undertake any permanent trading activities in raising funds for their charitable objects.

Review of Progress and Achievements

During this financial year to 31st March 2004 the charity (pre incorporation) continued to purchase medical equipment and enhance the amenities and environment for the care of sick babies and children at various hospitals and units throughout the North West.

The charity achieved its aim to increase the amount available for charitable expenditure. The total was £330,421 (including savings of £35,282) (2003: £90,223 (including savings of £17,768).

As predicted trust fundraising increased the funding available, as more specifically restricted funds for specific projects were secured. The organisation also continued to widen the geographical area of benefit and assisted new hospitals and projects in Wigan, Bury, Burnley, Chester and Ormskirk.

The charity has undergone a period of change, with relocation to new commercial premises at the beginning of the year, followed by a full review of the operations and objects. One of the key recommendations of the review was to change the name and create a new image. This was a very emotive issue.

The trustees also took the decision to change legal status and set up a company limited by guarantee with a new charity registration. You will note that Children's Hospitals Appeal Trust therefore transferred all assets and activities at the year-end to the company.

Since originally being established in 1985 the requirements of the health sector and the needs of our beneficiaries has changed. The charity objectives have been adapted to reflect this and we are now able to assist with projects throughout the community as well as on hospital sites. Whilst the new charity will continue to direct most of its help to local North West beneficiaries, the geographical reach is increased so that we can help raise valuable funds in other parts of the country, to help needy children in those areas as well.

Future Developments

Since its formation the charity raised in excess of £8 million and the new charitable company will continue with the same activities. We are delighted at our past success and reconfirm our commitment to ongoing supporters and beneficiaries. We will continue to enhance healthcare for babies and children in need with our help through the new charitable company.

The trustee directors see the relaunch under the new brand as enhancing our future activities. They are confident that the core values of the charity will be maintained and our new image will ensure the ongoing success and improvement in our ability to support projects on a widening geographical basis.

Our new name MedEquip4Kids meets all the criteria. The new image has met with universal approval and the trustee directors are delighted with both the name and concept of focussing activities around the new mascot character of Pip. The feedback from supporters and donors has been extremely positive and Pip captures the imagination of children and adults alike

In the first 6 months MedEquip4Kids has raised in excess of £400,000 and has seen a marked improvement in the number of enquiries and applications for funding. We have completed projects and agreed commitments of almost £300,000 so far this year.

In the coming 12 months the charity is looking to enhance the profile and improve marketing to widen the nature of fundraising activities in the future.

2005 also sees the twentieth anniversary of the charity and we are currently considering how to mark this significant occasion in our brief but successful history.

Review of the Result and Reserves Policy

The trustees consider that the results set out in the attached accounts are satisfactory. They are of the opinion that the balance on the reserves are sufficient to meet any future commitments under the terms of the funding.

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds at a level which covers current commitments under the terms of their funding.

Risk Management

The trustees have examined the major strategic, business and operational risks that the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reviews to be carried out so that necessary steps can be taken to lessen these risks.

Investment Policy and Returns

Under the trust deed the charity has the power to make any investment which the trustees see fit. The trustees have considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds and have found that placing funds on deposit meet their requirements given the secure nature and accessibility of the funds. The trustees consider the return to be reasonable given the low risk nature of the deposits.

Description of Organisation

The charity is run by a team of volunteer trustees who manage the direction and policies of the charity. The day to day management is run by the director of administration and director of fundraising who are supported by a team of fundraising and administrative staff and volunteers.

Statement of Trustees Responsibilities

Company Law requires the trustees to prepare the financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity as at the Balance Sheet date and of its surplus or deficit for that year. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make adjustments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether the policies adopted are in accordance with the relevant legislation and with applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time its financial position and to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985 They are also responsible for safeguarding its assets and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention of fraud and other irregularities.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation of accounts

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2000) issued in October 2000, SORP Update Bulletin 1 issued in December 2002, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985.

The company has taken advantage of exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement on the grounds that it qualifies as a small company.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, land, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Plant and machinery

18% - 25% on cost

Incomina resources

Funds introduced relate to the taking over of the net assets and activities of the Greater Manchester Children's Hospitals Research and Development Trust. The amount shown as income during the year related solely to the net assets value

Income in future years will consist of:

Voluntary income and donations, fees generated from its charitable activities and investment income

Fees generated from charitable activities comprise of amounts receivable during the year. Voluntary income and donations are accounted for as received.

Resources expended

All expenditure other than that capitalised is reflected in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis.

Expenditure which is directly attributable to specific activities has been included in these cost categories. Where costs are attributable to more than one activity, they have been apportioned across the cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of these resources.

Cost of generating funds comprises costs incurred in inducing people and organisations to contribute financially to the charity's work. This includes advertising and the staging of fundraising events.

Costs of management and administration includes all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activities or fundraising ventures.

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities over the period they are incurred.

Taxation

The organisation is exempt from income tax by reason of its charitable status. Income tax suffered on investment income is reclaimed in full. The organisation is not registered for value added tax but can claim exemption from certain purchases.

Investments

Investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date.

Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.
