CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman's Report to the Annual General Meeting

Introduction

The last year has been one of continued progress – with particular success for the CHRT's key long term Llanelly House project – though the Trust continued to pursue a range of other important heritage projects

Llanelly House

The Lianelly House project itself continued to develop through close working partnership with and for the owner, Lianelli Town Council This involved major professional input and support from CHRT personnel Key events during the year included

- a new application to the Heritage Lottery Fund for a 70% grant to a project costed at just under £5m was positively received (submitted in early July 2007)
- growing support and involvement from the County Council who by February 2008 were a major force in the professional team supporting the project
- the employment of Melanie Candy as Project Development Co-ordinator (supported by Hidden Dragon and AHF funding)
- development of a whole range of key strategy and other documentation, plans and costings, generously supported by the Town Council
- development of a potential partnership with Trinity College Carmarthen to run part of the upper floor of the restored House as a heritage oriented enterprise incubator space (March 2007)
- further development of a very positive working relationship with the County Council who offered to take on the heritage use of the middle floor of the restored House
- continuing to strengthen and develop the core relationship between the CHRT and Llanelli Town Council

The Big Picture: following on from the success story of 2006/07, the Project moved into Stage 2 and supported two members of the CHRT team – Cheryl Kitt and Ken Day – to work with a group of special needs pupils at Ysgol Tregib, Llandeilo Big Picture 2 worked with these young people to take forward their interest in the landscape and develop it into a well received photographic exhibition of their work. The project was generously supported by the Countryside Council for Wales and is to be further developed across Carmarthenshire and beyond in a larger and more ambitious project in 2008/10 that will provide a model for similar activity throughout West Wales

Kidwelly Town Hall: hopes for this valuable restoration project in Kidwelly came to an end with the withdrawal of the key local scheme promoters

Financial Performance

Our turnover and financial activity increased somewhat on the previous year, turnover being £94,000 (£20,000 in 2007) This was matched with a number of major chantable donations in relation to Llanelly House totalling £150,000 of paid and offered financial assistance

As always, we received excellent support from our accountants – L H Phillips & Co of Carmarthen and our VAT advisor – Alun Mathias of VAT Capital Both are offering vital services as we begin to see an increased turnover as the Llanelly House project gets underway

Membership

During the year, in June 2007, we saw the sad departure from the ranks of trustees of Philip James – who played such a crucial part in the early days of establishing, supporting and giving a home to the Trust in its office in Llandeilo We thank him most sincerely for his generosity and wish him well for the future. As the year ends, we are actively recruiting new membership with three new members in consideration together with possible nomination to the CHRT of two elected members of partner organisations.

Staffing

The period saw the employment of Melanie Candy from June 2007 to February 2008 as Llanelly House Project Co-ordinator. Her work played a key part in getting the HLF application for Llanelly House off the ground and building community partnerships at several levels. We also saw the arrival of Cheryl Kitt as a regular freelance member of the team and benefited from her assistance in the Big Picture Project at Tregib School

The Trust's Secretary, Robert Parker, was confirmed in the active role of Chief Executive Officer and worked on a project funded per diem basis for a growing amount of time. This development was welcomed as a step to securing a full time executive officer to run and to develop the Trust.

Conclusion

I would again wish to show my appreciation to my vice chair, J C Williams MBE, for his support and for taking the Chair on my occasional absences and to all my fellow Trustees for their enthusiastic commitment. The various partners also played a crucial role during the year – particularly the Llanelli Town Council, the National Trust (for whom I have the honour of acting as Chair in Wales), Trinity College and Carmarthenshire County Council. All have provided essential resources, support and advice throughout the year

Finally, 2008/09 already promises to be a most exciting year with HLF and other support for Llanelly House confirmed We look forward to this and other projects with great enthusiasm
