Chairman's Report for the year ended 31st March 2018

Introduction

The year 2017-18 saw several resignations of Trustees reducing the Board to four members, namely John C. Williams, MBE, Susan Roberts, Alison Evans, and Tom Lloyd. The year saw a significant reduction in the number of House tours, but an encouraging improvement in the patronage of the Cafeteria that operates on a reasonable break-even basis. Staffing levels have been reduced to achieve cost reductions, whilst activity, including wedding receptions, has improved. Efforts continue to dispose of the Trust's ownership of the former YMCA building in Merthyr Tydfil.

Plas Llanelly House Cyf, the trading arm for the commercial operations of CHRT continued to run the commercial activities at Llanelly House, but there is a pressing need to appoint additional Board members.

The Trust is indebted to Carmarthenshire County Council, and Llanelli Town Council for providing financial support to enable the discharge of outstanding debts through a commercial voluntary agreement, thus allowing an opportunity to restructure the Trust's activities.

Plas Llanelly House was fortunate to have very considerable assistance during the year from Business Wales to address the re-structuring of CHRT and Plas Llanelly House plus other associated governance matters for which the trustees are most appreciative.

The trustees would like to record their grateful thanks to the staff of CHRT and Plas Llanelly House for their dedication and enthusiasm during what continues to be a period of change. In addition the trustees are grateful for the efforts made by a small team of volunteers who work to support the aspirations of Plas Llanelly House in promoting it as a unique experience.

Personal

In previous annual reports, I have taken the opportunity to pay tribute to the loyalty and dedication of our staff, and this I do so once again without any reservations whatsoever. I must also pay tribute to my remaining Trustees, whose administrative and financial skills have clearly encouraged our various stakeholders and external funding bodies to provide invaluable support that has enabled the Trust to look forward with a degree of confidence. We are truly grateful and appreciative of such help, and thank them most sincerely.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Charity's objectives for the benefit of the people of Wales and the public at large to preserve, restore and regenerate, the historical, architectural, archaeological and environmental interest.

To advance the education of the public in history, arts, culture and heritage in Wales.

In pursuance of its objectives to promote such charities or charitable purposes as the Charity may by unanimous resolution of its members from time to time.

As the Trust is now focusing primarily on preserving the heritage of Llanelly House, and has no funding opportunities for future projects, including the regeneration of the Merthyr Tydfil YMCA. The aim in this financial year has been to seek to dispose of the YMCA at Merthyr Tydfil. The Charity will need to review its name, objectives and aims during the next financial year and seek approval from both the Charity Commission and Companies House for these changes.

Public benefit

The trustees confirm that they have complied with their duty in section 17(5) of the 2011 Charities Act with regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives in planning of future activities.

The CHRT Limited has demonstrated that our aims are for public benefit through the provision of activities and events which have enabled all to enjoy and experience it including activities such as the Community Engagement work that continues through the efforts of the Llanelly House team.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2018

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities PROJECTS

Lianelly House Operation

During 2017/18 Llanelly House led 2,800 guided tours with the café enjoying an increased number of paying visitors and the revenue increased by more than 18% on the previous year.

The Heritage Lottery Resilience Grant awarded to CHRT in March 2017 for a two year period which enabled a number of developments and improvements to be made to Plas Llanelly House operations to allow for progress to be made in trading more successfully and ensuring the viability and sustainability of CHRT and the trading arm Plas Llanelly House CYF. This funding facilitated the cost of a number of staff, the appointment of a Commercial and Events Manager, improvements to the kitchen, increased marketing, and work commencing on improvements to the web site.

The appointment of an experienced Events and Commercial Manager in August 2017 funded by the HLF further enabled the house to make plans to increase its revenue through extensive marketing, the provision of a wider range of commercial activities including weddings, themed evenings, events specifically for children and their families such as princess teas, Murder Mystery, gin evenings etc. and these events built on the already growing reputation of the house.

Merthyr Tydfil YMCA

Throughout the year regular meetings were held between CHRT trustees and representatives of Merthyr Tydfil CBC to enable the potential transfer of this building to their portfolio. Such a transfer will only take place if Merthyr Tydfill CBC are successful in obtaining funding for the project.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The CHRT Limited is entirely reliant on earned income and grants and the principal sources during 2017/18 were

- Carmarthenshire County Council Llanelly House.
- Heritage Lottery Fund Llanelly House.
- Management Income Llanelly House.
- Merthyr Town Council YMCA.

Investment policy and objectives

The CHRT Limited had no investments and there were therefore no social, ethical or environmental issues relating to the policy aspects.

Reserves policy

At present there are no free reserves. The Trustee's aim is to increase the reserves through planned operating surpluses.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Going concern

As at 31 March 2017 (the previous year end) the charity entered into a Company Voluntary Arrangement (CVA). This arrangement was satisfied during the year. The notice of full implementation of voluntary arrangement was filed at the court and forwarded to the registrar of companies on 5 April 2018. As a result of the above the unrestricted fund is no longer in deficit.

CHRT Limited secured resilience grant funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund in an offer dated 31 March 2017. This has enabled them to put in place business improvements as the project progresses.

The trustees therefore consider it appropriate for the financial statements to be prepared on a going concern basis.

FUTURE PLANS

It is clear that the main objective for the charity is to ensure its operations are sustainable in the mid to long term, it is clear that this will require constant vigilance and review of the business plan and objectives with accurate monitoring of targets and margins.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a charitable company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New trustees are recruited from individuals who are already supportive of the charity and its objectives. The Trust follows best practice in the recruitment and training of trustees as suggested by both the Charity Commission and the Wales Council for Voluntary Associations.

Initial training includes a full briefing on the operation of the trust, details of trustee responsibilities and liabilities, health and safety and are provided with financial information together with a copy of the governing document. A skills audit is undertaken when appropriate ensures that current trustees have the requisite skills and experience to undertake their role fully and competently and to identify potential gaps.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March 2018

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to the trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - 2% on cost

Long leasehold - in accordance with the property

Plant and machinery - 20% on cost

Fixtures and fittings - 25% on reducing balance

Individual fixed assets costing £500 or more are initially recorded at costs.

Included in Fixtures & Fittings are the Llanelly House Collection of artefacts. Due to their historic value these have not been depreciated.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Notes to the Financial Statements - continued for the year ended 31st March 2018

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

The Trustees consider that there may have been a diminution in value of Freehold Property since the date of the last professional valuation. However, the property is included in the Balance Sheet in accordance with the last valuation report provided by Alder King on 23 October 2015.

Long Leasehold Property was valued on an open market basis on 5 December 2014 by Alder King Property Consultants. The Trustees consider the open market valuation at this date to be a fair estimation of the valuation of Long Leasehold Property as at 31 March 2018.

Llanelly House: A restricted fund whereby funds are restricted for the use of restoration and development of Llanelly House.

YMCA: A restricted fund whereby funds are restricted for the use of restoration of the YMCA building in Merthyr Tydfil.

The Big Picture Llanelly House: A restricted fund that allowed for the purchase of the portrait painted by Sir Joshua Reynolds PRA (1723-1792) of Sir John Stepney 8th Baronet (1743-1811), its restoration and re-hanging at Llanelly House.

CADW: A restricted fund whereby funds are restricted for use on the professional fees associated with the CVA.

Heritage Lottery Fund: A resilience grant whereby funds are restricted to support business development as outlined in the Landsker report.

17. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

As at 1 April 2017 there was an intercompany loan owing to CHRT Limited from CHRT Ventures Limited totalling £8,069. During the year CHRT Limited made further loans to CHRT Ventures Limited totalling £1,567. The loan balance of £9,636 has been written off as a bad debt during the year.

As at 1 April 2017 there was a trade debtor balance of £3,400 owing to CHRT Limited from CHRT Ventures Limited. This balance has been written off as a bad debt during the year.

During the year management charges of £37,200 were charged to Plas Llanelly House Cyf.

As at 1 April 2017 there was an intercompany loan owing to CHRT Limited from Plas Llanelly House Cyf totalling £46,215. During the year Plas Llanelly House Cyf repaid this balance. At 31 March 2018 there was an intercompany loan owing to Plas Llanelly Cyf from CHRT Limited totalling £4,091.

The Charity is controlled by the Trustees who are all Directors of the Company.
