Director's Report of the for the year ended 31 March 2004

The directors, who are also trustees of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2004.

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee and was incorporated on the 8th of April 2002. It is governed by a memorandum and articles of association. Its objects are to relieve poverty, deprivation and distress throughout the world through practical help, to advance the Christian religion in any part of the world and such charitable objects as the trustees shall from time to time determine.

Review of activities and future developments

Much activity has taken place in the first year of the charity's existence of which the following are the main points:-

- A fully equipped rent free office has been acquired in Bradford on Avon.
- The office has been completely kitted out with computers, telephones, work stations and other suitable equipment.
- A full range of professional stationery has been designed and printed.
- A 35 page web site has been designed and established.
- A mailing list of 200 people has been established.
- A number of projects and potential projects have been identified and visited.
 These include:
 - (1) The Joseph Foundation in Iasi, Romania (JF). The JF has for some years identified children living on the streets in Iasi and has provided a residential home for such abandoned and abused children with a view to their reintegration into families. Although the JF has ran for a number of years, because of lack of funding they have had to suspend their activities. As a result of an agreement with Robin Hood Ministries (RHM) for regular funding the house has re-opened to 15 children. The intention is that RHM will help maintain the ministry to these and further children by continued funding.
 - (2) A grant has been given to CMS Missionary Susie Hart to start teaching disabled people in Tanzania how to make craft goods and sale them. This is operating under the name Neema Crafts.
 - (3) A project to help Christians in Kitido, North East Uganda build a multi-purpose building that can be used as a church, school, medical centre has got underway.

- (4) A number of other projects have also been considered including assistance with a veterinary surgeon with CMS in Tanzania and help for a KidzKlub on housing estates in Canterbury, Kent.
- All the above projects have been visited by charity founder and officer Paul Skelton during the year.
- Good standing and awareness has been generated in one church in particular, Holy Trinity Combe Down, which has adopted the Joseph Foundation as its millennium project with regular support and events to help finance the Joseph Foundation House.
- Good contacts have been established with local business, The Chamber of Commerce in Bradford on Avon and with other charities such as Christian Viewpoint for Men.
- A professional quality display stand has been donated and it is intended to take a stand at New Wine Conference in Shepton Mallet in July/August 2005.
- Much work has been done to prepare the ground for business net working with a view to targeting businesses to support projects.
- A network of most helpful volunteers has been established.

Income Generation

Income generation during the first year has come from an initial grant from RHM's sister organisation Firelighters. A widening base of support from individuals and companies is emerging with gift aid donations supplementing the income together with the Millennium Fund contributions mentioned above. No legacies have yet been received.

Support from Trust Funds is being sought with a view to covering, in particular, administrative expenses.

Investment policy and returns

At this stage in its development the charity has not had sufficient funds to invest other than in an interest bearing bank account since most of its funds are required for its developing projects.

Volunteers and employee involvement

The charity is most grateful for the effort of willing volunteers who are involved in service provision and donation of their expertise in different areas from setting up the web site, helping prepare a business plan to assistance with administrative tasks.

The founder of the charity Paul Skelton has largely self-financed himself giving his time voluntarily to the charity. It is a high priority of the trustees to find sufficient funding to employ him on a salaried basis. There is also urgent need for paid administrative assistance.
