Financial Report

Income

Without the cost of medals, which were paid for last year, the profits from Championships rose this year even allowing for some costs in repairing and engraving some of our trophies.

Subscriptions look healthy following the recent increase and the collection by direct debit rather than standing order. More schools paid this year and we were also able to collect some arrears. Similarly with Individuals we now have more members, more paid their subscriptions this year and we still have a number who have not yet cancelled their standing orders.

The Gift Aid payment is welcome and this should now be a regular, and slightly larger, amount each year.

Expenditure

There are few areas to highlight:

- Secretarial fees were slightly higher as we used more manpower to produce the Annual Review last year. This was a one-off situation.
- Higher production costs results in the increase in printing expenditure
- Only one Level 2 coaching course was held last year and the RFA did not have any attendees
- Website expenses should fall again next year now that the new site has
- In view of the surplus subscriptions from some individuals, donations were made out of the General account (rather than the 100 Club or Charitable Trust) to UCL and Bristol University to assist in establishing and growing their clubs

With regard to the 100 Club, the grant relates to continuing contributions towards coaching costs at Edinburgh Academy. The monthly bank charges are an irritant,

particularly given the size of the Fund so we have decided to close this account once the regular contributors have switched their standing orders to our other account at NatWest, which is currently operated free of charge.

The Jesters fund continued to be put to good use with disbursements being made throughout the season to assist younger members and students to attend various championships. We were fortunate to receive a further grant of £2000 during the year and we are extremely grateful to the Jesters for their generosity and support in providing these funds.

The Board is happy with the healthy position shown and recommends the accounts for approval by the meeting.
