DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2004

The directors and trustees submit their report and accounts for the year ended 31 July 2004.

The company was incorporated on 23 July 2003 under the Companies Act 1985 as a company limited by guarantee, and is therefore governed by a memorandum and articles of association. During the year the company applied for charitable status and on 24 September 2004 the charity became registered with the Charity Commission in England and Wales.

On 1 August 2003 the remaining net assets of the unincorporated charity 'Leeds Faith in Schools' were transferred to Leeds Faith in Schools, a company limited by guarantee. The transfer was in accordance with the unincorporated charity's constitution and a resolution to transfer the funds had been signed by the trustees.

OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY, PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ORGANISATION OF OUR WORK

The object of the charity and its principal activity is to promote the advancement of religion and education and to benefit the community of Leeds and its surrounding areas. In particular:

- To assist Religious Education Departments, Personal and Social Education Departments and those responsible for School Assemblies;
- To promote the discussion of moral, ethical, justice, relief and development issues;
- To encourage and support Christian Unions and other Christian groups and societies;
- To forge links with local churches and church based groups and between schools and churches
- To promote and liaise with Christrian Youth Culture Events;
- To help initiate Parent/Teach prayer groups in schools

DEVELOPMENTS ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR

The work of Leeds Faith in Schools has continued unabated with our schools workers contributing to many areas of school life, including assemblies, RE lessons, sport, mentoring and counselling, depending on the needs of the individual school. The Workers are valued and respected members of the school community in which they work.

Directors

There were no changes in the makeup of the Directors. Andrew Royston was appointed as Honorary Treasurer.

Looking Back

- The Directors continued to encourage and support the Schools Workers in all that they did across
 the city. Much of their information came from Project Manager who regularly reported on the work
 that was being carried out in each school.
- It was with sadness that we said goodbye to Abi Monteith, our Morley Schools Worker, at the end of the Christmas Term. Following her departure, negotiations took place with St Peter's Church, Morley, and the Directors agreed to a proposal to enter a partnership with the church to share a Youth Worker. The person appointed would continue Abi's work in the Morley schools.
- It was agreed that Network Leeds would take responsibility for the Faith in Schools' website and would also produce the termly newsletter, an important information point for our supporters where we announce new initiatives and prayer needs.
- Volunteers continued to support the workers in different aspects of the work, e.g. by helping at lunchtimes with Rock Solid clubs.
- The Schools Workers were assisted throughout the year by a number of associate workers. Networking with other youth agencies in the city was maintained and developed.

Tentative discussions were held with the Chair of Governors of Temple Moor School in East Leeds to place a worker in the school, possibly shared with Brigshaw School.

DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2004

Finances

- The Directors were grateful to Andrew Royston for agreeing to become Treasurer. Andrew reported to the Directors on a regular basis.
- The financial crises of mid 2003 led to a substantial increase in giving from individuals and churches to whom the Directors extend their thanks.
- Applications to Trusts continued and we are grateful to those trusts who continue to make regular donations.
- We are thankful to all those who support us on a regular monthly basis, both individuals and churches.
- Two schools agreed to financially support the work of Leeds Faith in Schools and this model is to be encouraged.
- A donation from Leeds Christian Community Trust enabled Sarah Bradford to increase her working hours to a full five days.

Premises

The Charity continues to be grateful to Burley St Matthias Church for its generous rental terms. However, the lack of office space is now a serious problem. Several alternative venues have been inspected in an attempt to find larger premises, but, as yet, nothing suitable has been found.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The year 2003-2004 has been a period of consolidation, but the Directors now wish to engage with the Workers in looking at future vision. Some proposals include:

- Finding new premises.
- · Asking more schools where we have a worker to contribute some funding.
- Increasing our donor base further.
- Expanding the work into more schools and more areas.
- Engaging in a dialogue with the schools, parents and churches in East Leeds to raise money for a Worker in two schools in East Leeds.

The Directors extend their gratitude once again this year to all the Schools Workers, the Project Director, Project Administrator, Associate Workers and Volunteers. Each person, paid or unpaid, plays a major role in the success of this work and the Directors wish to record their immense gratitude to them all for their enthusiasm and commitment to Leeds Faith in Schools.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Directors have implemented a risk management strategy which comprises:

- An annual review of the risks which the charity may face;
- The establishment of systems and procedures to mitigate those risks identified;
- The implementation of procedures designed to minimise any potential impact on the charity should any of those risks materialise.

DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2004

RESERVES POLICY

The Directors have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ('the free reserves') held by the charity should be 3 months of resources expended (£35,591). At this level the Directors feel they would be able to continue the activities of the charity in the event of a drop in funding and enable sufficient time for replacement funding to be sourced. At present the free reserves amount to £57,576. The policy will be reviewed annually.

DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

Under the articles of association all the directors shall retire at the first AGM and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.

At subsequent AGM's one third of the directors, who are subject to retirement by rotation, shall retire from office.

All the directors of the company are also trustees of the charity. The trustees who served during the year under review and to date are set out on page 3.

STATEMENT OF THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

Company law requires the Board to prepare financial statements for each financial period which gives a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company as at the end of the financial period and of the profit and loss of the Company for that period.

In preparing those financial statements the Board is required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2004

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation of accounts.

The financial statements are prepared under the historic cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Directors' and Trustees' Report and all of which are continuing. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities, issued in October 2000, SORP Update Bulletin 1 issues in December 2002, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985.

(b) Incoming Resources

Donations are recognised when received by the charity.

Income tax recoverable on gift aid donations is recognised when the income is recognised. Income arising from the provision of services and the hire of equipment is recognised when an invoice is raised.

(c) Fixed Assets and depreciation

Fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalised. Depreciation is provided to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual values, of all fixed assets over their expected useful lives. Depreciation has been charged at the following rate:

Fixtures and equipment - 33% straight line method

(d) Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

(e) Restricted funds

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund

Note B

The restricted fund transferred represents those donations, from both Charitable Trusts and individuals, which have been made to enable the purchase of specific equipment. The monies have been spent in accordance with the restrictions and because the restriction has now been complied with the net book value of the assets purchased have now been transferred into unrestricted funds. The funds received during the year were to contribute to the salary costs for both the volunteer coordination and work in the schools.
