The ultimate controlling party is Barclays Wealth Trustees (Jersey) Limited formerly known as Walbrook Trustees (Jersey) Limited The date that it changed its name was 27 March 2008 Barclays Wealth Trustees (Jersey) Limited is a trustee of the Dooba Settlement, a life interest trust

On 28 March 2008 the ultimate parent company became Truetville Management Limited, a company incorporated in Cyprus, which acquired Barclays Wealth Trustees (Jersey) Limited shares in GMV Holdings Limited
