#### Trustees' Report

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing Document

The company was incorporated on 22nd August 2003, registration no 04875074 and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles, as amended on 14th September 2005 and 29th March 2011. The company is also a registered Charity no 1112206 and subject to the Charities Act 2011.

#### Structure

The company is currently governed by a Board of five Trustees

#### Appointment of Trustees

The Trustees are appointed by the membership at the Annual General Meeting

#### Risk Management

The Trustees have introduced a risk management process to assess business risks and are implementing systems to mitigate these risks. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures or authorisation of all transactions and projects and to ensure consistent quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charitable company. Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety of staff, clients and visitors to the premises. These procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the charity.

#### Public Benefit

CNW is a member of Social, Environmental & Economic Partners together with other organisations such as Voluntary Sector North West and the North West Migrants Network With our secure regional base, during 2011/12 CNW has continued to be able to operate as a regional partner and contact point with a number of national community development and regeneration bodies such as Community Development Exchange, the Community Development Foundation, the Federation of CD Learning, Community Matters and Urban Forum

#### Achievements & Performance

Community Groups across the region have been looking for alternative strategies to allow them to continue in the face of cuts to their funding CNW assisted Manchester Metropolitan University in helping get their Resilience Survey to a wide range of small to medium sized groups and having successfully been awarded a grant from Awards for All, held a series of meetings to discuss the survey culminating in a conference in Manchester in December. The survey gave us over 200 responses and further meetings to discuss the results will continue into 2012/13, once the final report is available.

CNW continues to use its website to keep community groups informed and we are endeavouring to improve the site in the near future. With the cost of design, printing and postage now so high, the website is crucial for our members and contacts who need our assistance.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 5 April 2012

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Companies Act 2006

#### Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 14

#### Incoming resources

Donations are recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the statement of financial activities at the same time as the gift to which they relate

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract or where entitlement to grant funding is subject to specific performance conditions. Grant income included in this category provides funding to support programme activities and is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

#### Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them

#### Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters

#### Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage

### Fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £100 or more are initially recorded at cost

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows

### Operating leases

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged in the statement of financial activities on a straight line basis over the lease term
