#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 11 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

#### Going Concern

The company's current loan facility of £12,797,949 expired on 6 July 2011. After the year end, the loan was subsequently renewed, and the term extended to 30 June 2015. The directors, in their consideration of going concern, have reviewed the company's future cash forecasts and revenue projections, which they believe are based on prudent market data and past experience and believe, based on those forecasts and projections, and subject to the continued availability of financing from NAMA, that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that would result if the company was unable to continue as a going concern.

#### 1 2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated)

#### 1.3 Stock

Stock represents property acquired for developments together with work in progress on those properties. These assets are included at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost for this purpose comprises the purchase cost of the land and buildings and development expenditure.

Profit on the sale of developed properties is taken on receipt of sales proceeds at legal completion Costs attributable to each sale comprise an appropriate proportion of the total costs of the development

#### 1.4 Deferred taxation

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date except that the recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that the company anticipates to make sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing differences

Deferred tax balances are not discounted

#### 1.5 Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to profit over the term of the debt so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount. Finance costs include issue costs, which are initially recognised as a reduction in the proceeds of the associated capital instrument.

#### 1.6 Other operating income

Other operating income comprises rental income net of value added tax and expenses directly attributable to the rental property
