Strategic report for the year ended 31 December 2014

Business Model and Strategy

Full details of the Company's results are contained in the financial statements on pages 9 to 18.

A strategic review of the structure of Ageas UK's Retail businesses was concluded in the year ended 31 December 2014, during which it was decided that the Company's activities would be transferred to Ageas Retail Limited (formerly Ageas 50 Limited). On 30 November 2014 the trade and net assets, excluding existing customer debtor balances and the servicing of these and investments, were transferred to Ageas Retail Limited. The existing customer debts will continue to be serviced and run off over the remainder of the policy term.

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The Board considers that, in view of the transfer of trade and assets of the Company to Ageas Retail Limited, it is appropriate to draw up financial statements on a 'non-going concern' basis. This conclusion has been reached having considered the provisions of FRS 18 Accounting Policies which requires entities to use the going concern basis, unless the directors intend to cease trading. Based on this the Directors consider it appropriate that these financial statements are not prepared on a going concern basis. The effect of this is explained in note 1.

Express Insurance Services Limited ('the Company') retailed to customers under its own brand predominantly through the online channel. Motor, bike and van insurance services were sold under the Express brand until 30 November 2014 and underwritten by a panel of leading insurance companies thus enabling competitive quotations for risks to be offered to customers. Sales and service calls are handled at the Company's contact centre in Uddingston (Glasgow). The Company has over one hundred thousand policies including additional products.

The Board considers that the key indicators that will communicate the financial performance and strength of the Company to its members are:

- Turnover
- Profit before income taxes
- Expense Ratio

The Board also uses a number of other key indicators to assess the performance of individual parts of the business, including details on the number of policies written and various performance ratios.

Financial Performance

The amount of turnover drives the overall size and profitability of the Company. Revenue has increased from the prior year due to changes implemented during 2013. The Company had implemented changes to minimise their exposure to credit risk and customer bad debt, with a short term detrimental effect in that year, with the benefits being realised in this reporting period.

Profit before income taxes has increased significantly from the prior year as a result of the increased turnover as well as reduced costs. The changes implemented in the prior year yielded an increase in turnover and profit as had been planned.

The growth in turnover has been achieved whilst also reducing costs through improved costs management. The Company also benefitted from a reduced management charge from the immediate parent company due to reduced staff costs.

Shareholders' equity

The Company's equity increased by £0.5m (2013: £1.0m decrease) representing profit after tax transferred to reserves. No dividend was paid in the year (2013: £nil).

Assets

Total assets decreased by £5.1m (2013: £11.6m) during the year, primarily due to the transfer of the business to Ageas Retail Limited.

Liabilities

Total liabilities decreased by £5.6m (2013: £10.5m), also as a result of the transfer of non customer assets and liabilities to Ageas Retail Limited.

Cash flow

Cash available to the Company decreased by £0.8m (2013: £0.1m increase) as all cash balances were transferred to Ageas Retail Limited.

Going Concern basis

A strategic review of the structure of Ageas UK's Retail businesses concluded during the year. This concluded that the trade of the different retail legal entities should be consolidated within Ageas Retail Limited. As a consequence no further business will be written through the Company after 30 November 2014.

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The Directors have prepared the financial statements on a non-going concern basis, as the Company is being wound down and will be struck off in due course once all existing customer policies have reached the end of the policy life.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The Company's operations expose it to a variety of financial risks that include the effects of credit risk and legislative and regulatory risk. The Company has in place a risk management programme that seeks to limit the adverse effects on the financial performance of the Company. The Company focuses strongly on risk management and has a culture within which risk management is firmly embedded.

Credit risk

The Company actively monitors amounts outstanding from customers and has a number of processes in place to minimise credit risk including identity checks and anti fraud measures.

Legislative and regulatory risk

The Company actively monitors compliance with the Financial Conduct Authority requirements and is proactive in establishing robust policies and procedures to ensure effective compliance.

Pursuant to section 487 of the Companies Act 2006, the auditors will be deemed to be reappointed and KPMG LLP will therefore continue in office.

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Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The Company has prepared the financial statements on a non-going concern basis.

The Board considers that, in view of the transfer of trade and assets of Express Insurance Services Limited to Ageas Retail Limited (formerly Ageas 50 Limited) on 30 November 2014, it is appropriate to draw up financial statements on a 'non-going concern' basis. This conclusion has been reached having considered the provisions of FRS 18 Accounting Policies which requires entities to use the going concern basis, unless the directors intend to cease trading. Following the run off of existing business there is the intention to have the Company struck off.

The directors have considered the accounting treatment of assets and liabilities in the balance sheet at 31 December 2014 and have concluded that no changes are required in light of adopting a 'non-going concern' basis for preparing the accounts.

Turnover

Turnover arises from continuing operations and comprises commissions and other income arising principally from the sale of insurance policies in the United Kingdom, recognised at the inception of the policy. An allowance is made for expected cancellations.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, net of depreciation and any impairment. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the assets over their estimated useful lives, as follows:

Fixtures and fittings, and plant and machinery - 10 - 20 per cent straight line

Cash

The Company is regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority ('FCA'). The Company has risk transfer agreements in place with all suppliers and is therefore not subject to the FCA's client money regulations. In its capacity as an intermediary, acting as an agent on behalf of insurers, the Company keeps insurer monies in a separate bank account. The total funds held in this account are included within cash at bank and in hand.

Insurance creditors

The Company acts as an agent in broking the insurance risk of its clients and is not liable as a principal for premiums due to underwriters or for claims payable to clients. Notwithstanding the legal relationship between clients and underwriters and since, in practice, premium monies are usually accounted for by insurance intermediaries, the Company has followed generally accepted accounting practice by showing cash and creditors relating to the sale of insurance policies as assets and liabilities of the Company.

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or right to pay less tax, with the following exceptions:

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- Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, or gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold.
- Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the Directors consider that it is more likely than
 not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing
 differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Operating leases

Operating lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Cash flow statement and related party disclosures

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Ageas SA/NV and its results are included in the consolidated financial statements of that company. Consequently, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS 1.

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 8 from disclosing transactions with related parties that are part of Ageas SA/NV or investees of the group.

Investments

Investments in Ageas Legal LLP are classified as fixed asset investments and are recorded in the balance sheet at cost less accumulated impairment. The carrying value of investments is reviewed at each reporting date. If an indication of impairment exists, the assets are written down to their recoverable amount and the impairment is charged to the profit and loss account in the year in which it arises.

Partnership profit share

Income from Ageas Legal LLP represents a share of the profits of the partnership. The profits are divided between the members as agreed by them from time to time and are recognised in the profit and loss account on an accruals basis.
