CHAIR'S STATEMENT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2012

Serco Leisure, the Trusts managing agent has continued to support the strategic direction of the Trust and this has been especially prevalent in light of substantial subsidy reductions. Despite the fact that the trust withdrew from the management of 4 facilities during the course of the year, we successfully opened Bolton One, a key facility for the portfolio. Despite these changes the Trust has increased footfall in to the centres and overall patronage year on year by 12%.

A varied program relating to Community engagement continues to thrive and we have seen great success with the Neighbourhood Life pilot project engaging with young children, local schools and community groups.

The focus remains on training of the staff with NVQ qualifications and vocational courses, and we have also been involved in a very positive apprentice scheme that has resulted in permanent employment for a number of the individuals

The year has been both challenging and exciting The opening of Bolton One, investment at Westhoughton supported by Olympic legacy funding and being one of the key partners in the Council's 2012 Year of Sport all provided a perfect platform to showcase our "leisure offer" and demonstrate our commitment to the provision of quality services tailored to the needs and aspirations of the Bolton family

The next twelve months presents further challenges as we endeavour to continue with a capital investment programme across the facilities and a further reduction in grant funding from the Council As previously we are taking a positive approach and continually seek service improvement and income generating opportunities to operate within reduced financial resources

I again would like to thank Trustees, officers of the Trust, Bolton MBC and Serco Leisure for their efforts in increasing participation, progressing the development of the leisure offer and commitment to continuous service improvement

- 3 To both maintain and increase participation by the current customer base and reduce levels of non participation.
- Working with the Bolton MBC Health & Sport Inclusion team, Serco Leisure, the Bolton PCT and other providers, identify and actively target those most in need to drive increased participation
- Rationalise the facility stock ensuring that what remains is appropriate and fit for purpose and at the same time investigate additional opportunities for existing sites
- Review centre programmes and identify focus sports and activities appropriate to local demand and needs taking into account NGB interest in working in/with Bolton

Funding

The Trust receives funding from Bolton Council to meet running expenses including deficit funding of its management contractor on the basis of the adjusted tender price. A profit share agreement with the management contractor provides funds which the Trust can subsequently use to invest in initiatives to pursue its objectives. The key areas are coaching / workforce development, 5 hour sports offer for school children, 45+ year olds who are at risk of coronary disease, people with long-term health conditions.

New investment funded from share of surplus has been identified in the year for:

- · Farnworth Pool Research
- Westhoughton fitness extension

Reserves

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are free reserves of the charity, at a level to meet anticipated unrestricted expenditure. This provides sufficient funds to cover management and administration and support costs. Unrestricted funds were maintained at this level throughout the year. The charity intends to maintain a minimum reserve of £10,000.

The company does not make distributions to members, and there is a minimal exposure to foreign exchange fluctuations
