The Trustees present their report, together with the Financial Statements of the Charitable Company for the year ended 31 March 2010 This report represents a trustees' report in accordance with the Charities Act

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Accounting Policies set out in note 1, the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006

The reference and administrative information on page 1 forms part of this report

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Queen Street Neighbourhood Resource Centre is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It was incorporated on 12 January 2004 and registered as a charity on 2 June 2004. The charity was established under a memorandum and articles of association which establishes the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its articles of association. In the event of winding up the members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Recruitment and Appointment of Directors

The Trustees of the company make up the Board of Directors which is elected each year by the members of the Chanty—th addition, three nominees from East Staffordshire Borough Council hold office as Trustees and Directors—The Chair is elected by the Trustees from among their number immediately following the Annual General Meeting

Trustees receive no remuneration for their work as trustees but are reimbursed for their out of pocket expenses, as claimed on an official form

Trustee Induction and Training

When a new trustee is appointed they are provided with a pack which contains

- Copies of the company's memorandum and articles of association
- Copy of the most recent annual report and accounts
- Copy of minutes of previous trustee meetings
- Copy of Chanty Commission guidance "The Essential Trustee"
- Copy of guidance to Councillors to ESBC nominees

Organisational Structure

The board of directors administers the chanty and meets on a monthly basis. The board delegate the day to day management of the centre to the administrator

Risk Management

The trustees have examined the major risks to which the Chanty is exposed and are satisfied that the systems are in place to mitigate those risks

Objectives and Activities

Objectives

Queen Street Neighbourhood Resource Centre (operating under the name of Queen Street Community Centre) aims to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of those areas known for administrative purposes as Anglesey Ward and that part of Burton Ward adjacent to Anglesey Ward but bounded by Station Street, Burton upon Trent (hereinafter called the area of benefit) without distinction of race, sex or of political, religious or other opinions

Queen Street Community Centre pursues these aim by

- 1 associating with the local authorities, voluntary associations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants
- 2 establishing a Community Centre and maintaining, managing and co-operating with any local statutory authority in the maintenance and management of the above aims and objectives
- 3 promoting any other charitable purpose in the area of benefit

QUEEN STREET NEIGHBOURHOOD RESOURCE CENTRE Report of the Trustees

Review of the Year's Activities and Future Developments

It is now five years since the centre reopened after the rebuilding work in 2005. Over this time the Charity has built links to all major agencies serving the community and provided a first class facility to enable them to access hard to reach groups. The Charity has had to review its staff arrangements to cover the opening hours, which are now extended from eight am until eight or nine pm, five days a week, plus varying hours on Saturdays.

Queen Street Community Centre Property

Disappointingly, the Charity continues to operate with an informal arrangement for lease (subletting) with East Staffordshire Borough Council. The potential benefits which would accrue to the Charity from defined long term occupation of the building continue to be a low priority for the County and Borough Councils.

The Chanty continues to work closely with the Paget Community and Learning Partnership, who have contracted for longer opening hours, to operate the SureStart "Children's Centre". The C&LP have assisted with alterations in the SureStart unit to create a consultation room for the community midwife service and a small training room with interactive white board. The C&LP has taken on more space to provide an operating base for a multi-agency team of community outreach workers. The IT room has been replaced by laptop computers which can be used anywhere in the building through a wireless network.

The Centre continues to seek solutions to problems with the heating system, which still overheats part of the building, while leaving other parts under heated. Alterations have been identified which could improve comfort while cutting operating costs and our carbon footprint.

Partner Organisations and Groups

The Chanty continues to support a limited number of organisations with rent free accommodation, the Money Spider Credit Union, "Police and Community Together", public consultation meetings and the Probation Service "Community Payback" scheme

Statutory Organisations and groups using the centre for meetings and training include
SureStart, Anglesey Parish Council, Burton College, Guinness Trust HA, Trent and Dove HA, the Primary
CareTrust, Barnardos, Stonhm Home for "Kiaura" domestic abuse support, Staffordshire Family Group for
"Parent Child contact meetings", the NHS "Healthy Kidz" project, ESBC for "Streets Ahead" evening children's
activities, Adult & Community Learning running English as a second language and basic mathematics courses,
the Social Services "Community Working Partnership" and the Community Midwife The centre is also used for
one off meetings by a range of organisations

Community Groups using the centre include the YMCA, East Staffs REC for the "Dove Mentoring" project, "Harvey Girls" a teenage mums group, a Polish Choir, a Bingo group, Silver Surfers, the Burton Civic Society, a rowing club for winter fitness training, a Polish mother & toddlers group, a Muslim group for occasional faith celebrations, "Socatots" small child & parent exercise and play, and finally our weekly Aerobics fitness group is now in its seventh year

The centre continues to be a popular venue hired for private parties and social events. The centre is widely used by all ethnic groups within the local community.

Future Plans

The Chanty is ready to help the Community in the difficult times ahead from a position of strength. The directors wait with interest to see what opportunities will be offered by the new government through their vision of the "Big Society".

Reserves

Unrestricted reserves at 31 March 2010 total £37,131 (2009 - £35,837)

The chanty's reserve policy is to hold a minimum of 6 months, and a maximum of 12 months, operating expenditure in unrestricted reserves

Trustee's Responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

Notes to the Accounts

for the year ended 31 March 2010

1 Accounting policies

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Chanties (SORP 2005) issued March 2005, applicable UK Accounting Standards, the Companies Act 2006 and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007)

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are those available for use at the discretion of the charity in furtherance of its general objectives and which have not been designated for other purposes

Restricted funds are those to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors

Incoming Resources

Incoming resources are included in the SOFA when it is quantifiable with reasonable accuracy Donated facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified and a third party is bearing the cost. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

Resources Expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis

Donations and Voluntary Income

Donations and voluntary income are accounted for gross when received

Deferred Income

Incoming resources are shown in the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate Where income is received in advance of and subject to certain conditions being met, for example advance payments for room hire, then it is treated as deferred income until those conditions are satisfied

Grants Receivable

Grants for immediate expenditure are accounted for when they become receivable. Grants received for specific purposes are treated as restricted funds

Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Fixed assets for charity use are capitalised at cost, where acquired, or market value as determined by the trustees where donated. They are stated in the financial statements at cost or original value less depreciation.

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost or valuation of the fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis

Aerobics equipment 7 years
CCTV equipment 8 years
Equipment 3 years
Furniture 15 years
Office and computer equipment 3 years

Allocation of costs

Costs are allocated between fundraising costs, direct costs in furtherance of the charity's objects and other expenditure according to the nature of the cost. Where items involve more than one category they are apportioned on a basis consistent with the use of the resource.
