Report of the trustees (incorporating the report) for the year ended 31 December 2008

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31st December 2008.

Constitution of Northwest Church

Northwest Church was incorporated as a charitable Company limited by guarantee with no share capital on 19th January 2004. The church is run in accordance with the memorandum and articles of association laid out at that time.

Principal activity and charitable objects

The principal activity of the charity is to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Statement of Beliefs in London Borough of Barnet and in such other parts of the UK or the world, as the trustees of the charity may from time to time think fit and to fulful such other purposes, which are exclusively charitable according to the law of England and Wales and are connected with the charitable work of the charity.

To relieve persons who are in conditions of need or hardship, or who are aged or sick and to relieve distress caused thereby in the said location and in such other parts of the UK or the world as the trustees may from time to time think fit and in other ways to serve and benefit the local community where there is need.

To advance education in accordance with Christian principles by such means as the trustees may consider appropriate, including by means of establishing and operating any educational establishment or establishments in the said location and in such other parts of the UK or world as the trustees from time to time think fit.

Trustees

On 10th January 2008, M A Kyte and D Straughton resigned as trustees and were duly replaced by J W Turner and B D Morgan. This was part of a long term plan to appoint trustees from within the church after five years. Therefore trustees who served from 10th January onwards and who have agreed to contribute £1 each in circumstances outlined in the Memorandum of Association are:

Funding sources

The overall budget for 2008 was set at £159,000 in order to fund continued growth and outreach projects into the local community and at the end of the year our total income (excluding investment income) was £125,656 and our spending was £137,361.

Our sole source of income for the church was donations from church members (and the Gift Aid that was reclaimed from this giving).

Recruitment of Trustees

New trustees are recruited by a process of current trustees and leaders in the church assessing who has the suitable level of skill, time and commitment to the vision and values of the church to take on the role of a trustee.

Report of the trustees (incorporating the report) for the year ended 31 December 2008

Review of activities and achievements

The 2008 financial year was a successful year for Northwest Church with many different areas of church life growing. Our key public meeting on Sunday morning continued to grow and flourish. In 2007 our average attendance at our Sunday morning service over the whole year was 83. In 2008 our average attendance grew to 106. Our highest Sunday attendance was 155 people.

The church continued to have a significant impact within the local community through the running of Alpha courses, mums and toddler groups, Alcoholics Anonymous meetings and became involved with an ongoing project of community involvement with the Grahame Park Estate in Colindale - an area of high social deprivation. On the Grahame Park Estate we ran a community festival, fun afternoons for children, community parties and exercise classes for young adults. During the Christmas season we also partnered with another local church and distributed 800 Christmas hampers to residents of the Grahame Park Estate. A youth club for 11 to 18 year olds has also been establised that meets in the Northwest Centre and serves the local community.

We have also seen our links with other local churches grow. We hosted a weekly meeting for local church ministers; helped to lead a monthly meeting for local Christians and took part in an annual Easter walk through Edgware.

Within the church we continued to train people to take on responsibility for initiating projects that will benefit the local community.

In September 2008 the church took on a full time trainee who worked as our graphic designer and did much to help our community activities. We also benefited from a gifted administrator in the church, offering her full time services to the church for a year. This did a great deal to ensure the smooth organisation and administration of the church. Furthermore, another church member agreed to voluntarily work for the church for two days a week, helping to maintain our small group system.

Reserves

The charity holds reserves at a level that is sufficient, in the opinion of the trustees, to meet its immediate charitable objectives.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

Company and charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2008

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding.

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

1.2. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Gifts donated for resale are included as income when they are sold. Donated assets are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified and a third party is bearing the cost. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included. Income tax recoverable on covenants and gift aid donations is recognised when received.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

1.3. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Resources expended are recognised in the year in which they are incurred.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management.

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
