#### INTRODUCTION

The following information about the financial year 2009/10 is presented in the format required by the Charity Commission

The Charity's full name is Newcastle and Gateshead Arts Studio Limited ("NAGAS")

NAGAS is a company limited by guarantee number 05028177, incorporated on 28 January 2004 and is governed by its articles and memorandum. It is a registered charity, number 1116957

### REFERENCE AND ADMINISTRATION DETAILS

Reference and administrative details are shown in the schedule of members of the board and professional advisers on page 1 of the financial statements

### **OBJECTIVES OF THE CHARITY**

To advance the education of the public, in particular persons suffering from the effects of mental illness and mental health problems, living in Newcastle and Gateshead (here-in after called the "area of benefit" through the use and promotion of art and artistic and creative activities

#### REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES, DEVELOPMENTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

#### Studio work

NAGAS has continued to deliver its service over this period in

- 4 day a week art studio service @ The Blackfriars Centre, 10am till 5pm
- 4 day a week art studio service @ St Nicholas' Hospital (this was a time restricted service and has now ended as of 30<sup>th</sup> July 2010)
- 1 day a week music service from the Sage Gateshead

Within these services we have run additional projects for different lengths of time in Printmaking, photography, pottery, felt making and digital manipulation of artwork

#### **Funding**

During this period the management of NAGAS has approached numerous funding streams with many reaching the last stages of review before being unfortunately declined. This though frustrating is very much a common feature to organisations such as ours, especially now with funding streams being even more competitive than ever

# **Future planning for funding**

As well as continuing on the focus around approaching charitable grants NAGAS is now reviewing its position around the new 'Personalisation agenda', and how it can develop a system to incorporate it into our working programme. Since the beginning of the year NAGAS has started charging a membership fee which is broken down into £10 every 3 months for each member. This very gentle first step approach to charging will hopefully ease the change into the personalisation agenda. NAGAS is acutely aware through negotiations with its members about the potential for unrest if sudden changes are implemented.

Though complex the personalisation agenda may very well become NAGAS's main source of income in future years as NAGAS has very high attendance levels at relatively low cost and unlike many other services does not rely on block funding from the LA or local health trusts

#### **Board**

NAGAS's board is currently under review to bring in new trustees and encourage greater service user involvement. Much support is provided by NAGAS's Chairman who has helped NAGAS to develop as a service and provide operational and financial support via Mental Health Concern. This relationship ensures accounts are correctly managed and supervision is offered to the manager who works within an environment with some very difficult and challenging behaviour.

NAGAS's new board members, once on board, will be able to support and develop the professional practice of NAGAS while injecting a new impetus to future work. However it will also be acutely aware that additional funding will be required to secure the future of NAGAS in 2011.

#### **Additional services**

The Art Room at St Nicholas was identified as a service which no longer fits into the NHS Trust's 'way of working' and therefore was to be closed

NAGAS was aware that without supporting the Art Room service users, they would lose a valuable service without any transition period. With that in mind NAGAS came in with a proposal to support the service. This could only be achieved if it received funding from the Trust, due to the trust's requirements to save money this would be only be until foundation status application in 18 months. This was achieved and NAGAS started management officially in the first week of May 2009.

NAGAS has supported members of the Art Room to become comfortable at using our community based Blackfriars Art Studio service. This allows for a much more considerate and well thought out closure of the Art Room while helping to establish The Blackfriars service.

To manage this transition NAGAS employed an additional worker. The new post will move into the Blackfriars studio service in August 2010 and offer invaluable support to the Studio manager by being able to work as both a professional artist and experienced fund raiser

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. In preparing the financial statements the charity follows best practice as set out in the Statement of Recommended Practice, 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' (SORP 2005), issued in March 2005.

#### Income

Income is recognised in the period in which the charitable company is entitled to receipt and the amount can be measured with reasonable certainty. Income is deferred only when the charity has to fulfil conditions before becoming entitled to it or where the donor specifies that it is to be expended in a future period.

# **Donations and grants**

Income from donations and grants, including capital grants, is included in incoming resources when these are receivable, except as follows

- When the donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods
- When donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use have been met

When donors specify that donations and grants, including capital grants, are for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources of restricted funds when receivable

# Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small

### Voluntary income

Voluntary income received by way of donations and gifts to the charity is included in full in the statement of financial activities when received.

### Charitable activities

Newcastle and Gateshead Arts Studio Limited has taken advantage of the exemption provided by the Charities SORP, not to use the expenditure headings and sub-headings as defined by the SORP
