04/05 Elections

Board of Trustees It was reported that under Articles 29 and 31 of NEMOCN's 'Articles of Association' the following applied:

- 29. At the first Annual General Meeting all the Trustees shall retire from office, and at every subsequent Annual General Meeting one-third of the Trustees. who are subject to retirement by rotation or, if their number is not three or a multiple of three, the number nearest to one third shall retire from office; but, if there is only one trustee who is subject to retirement by rotation, he shall retire.
- 31. If the Charity at the meeting at which a Trustee retires by rotation, does not fill the vacancy the retiring Trustee shall, if willing to act, be deemed to have been re-appointed unless at the meeting it is resolved not to fill the vacancy or unless a resolution for the re-appointment of the Trustee is put to the meeting and lost.

07/05 Financial Report

The NEMOCN Finance Manager presented the Statement of Financial Activities year ending 31 July 2004. The following was noted:

Budget 03/04

Income - significant differences:-

Budgeted learner registration increased by 30% Budgeted credit awards increased by 20% It was reported that both variances were due to an increase in learner registrations and credits awarded as stated in the annual report.

An income of £11,600 had been generated by NEMOCN offering training for under and over 25's on the New Deal Scheme.

A grant of £2,500 was awarded by the Nottinghamshire Community Foundation to NEMOCN for information sessions and seminars on the Credit and Qualifications framework particularly for the voluntary sector.

Expenditure - significant differences:-

Moderation Accreditation fees/travel up by19% - all outstanding amounts being accrued into the year of activity.

Premises up by 19% - due to the office move and all costs not being known when the budget was agreed.

NOCN Membership up by 18% - increased due to additional credits being awarded.

Budget 04/05

It was stated that reduced membership charges and no programme registration charges had simplified the charging structure in preparation for the National charging structure to be introduced in August 2005.

It was noted that it was a conservative budget with a surplus to build towards the Charities Commission recommended surplus of 3-6 months expenditure costs.
