## **Policy Field Priorities**

Active Labour Market Policies: This policy field focuses on improving the employability of the unemployed and seeks to prevent long-term unemployment. The regional plan addresses particular labour market issues in the region and will give particular support to the long-term unemployed, unemployed people from rural areas, people who need integrating into the labour market or upgrade limited or inappropriate skills.

Equal Opportunities and Social Inclusion: The focus here is on unemployed people from groups who are most at disadvantage in labour market terms. Within the region, priority for support will be given to a number of groups including people with disabilities, ethnic minorities, lone parents, people lacking basic and key skills, people subject to multiple disadvantage and young people at risk of disaffection in the education system.

Lifelong Learning: Aims to increase the number of people actively engaged in learning. Support is available to employed and unemployed people and the Regional Development Plan particularly addresses low basic skills, below average levels of attainment, skills gaps and shortages including higher level skills.

Adaptability and Entrepreneurship: This policy field aims to improve the skills base and adaptability of the individuals employed labour force and increase levels of entrepreneurship. Regional priorities will address skills deficiencies, low business formation rates, impediments to entrepreneurial development and business development training that targets women and disadvantaged groups.

Increasing the Participation of Women: Aims to reduce levels of disadvantage faced by women in the labour market. The regional plan will address particular issues including under-representation in certain sectors and managerial occupations, learning implications for women in part-time occupations and a significant gender pay gap in the region.

The Community Initiative, EQUAL: Tests new ways to fight discrimination and inequality in the labour market. It differs from the other ESF Objectives because it emphasises new and creative ideas and co-operation between EU Member States. Note that EQUAL is administered by ECOTEC
