Principal Activity and review of business

The principal activity of the Company is that of being a corporate member of Actis LLP (formerly known as Actis Capital LLP). Under the terms of the Members' Agreement relating to Actis LLP, no profits of Actis LLP were allocated to the Company in the year to 31 December 2008. The Company has not undertaken any other activity since incorporation and consequently has neither profit nor loss for the year therefore a profit and loss account has not been presented.

The Company was incorporated on 4 March 2004, with a share capital of 1 £1 ordinary share issued at par. Its registered office is 8th Floor, 2 More London Riverside, London, SE1 2JT.
