Report of the Trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 August 2014

The Trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2014. The Trustees, who are also Directors of Southend United Community & Educational Trust for the purposes of company law and who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Structure, governance and management

Governing Document

Southend United Community & Educational Trust is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The company was incorporated on 16 March 2004 and became a registered charity on 17 August 2004.

The Trustees, who are also the Directors for the purpose of company law and who served during the year were:

None of the Trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the Trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up. They meet regularly to administer the charity and are aware of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The Charity's objectives (and Objects) are for the benefit of the public generally and in particular, the inhabitants of South Essex and its surrounding areas:

- To promote community participation in healthy recreation by providing facilities for the playing of association football and other sports capable of improving health
- To provide and assist in providing facilities for sport, recreation or other leisure time occupation of such persons who have need for such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity of disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving their condition of life; and
- To advance the education of children and young people through such means as the Trustees think fit in accordance with the law of charity.

Southend United Community and Education Trust have 4 key themes:

Theme 1 - Sports Participation

We offer quality sports provision to a network of schools, groups and individuals throughout the calendar year. This is achieved through an extensive range of activities, each delivered by our highly skilled team of staff who are not only seen as coaches but also as positive role models by the many people that we come into contact with.

Theme 2 - Health

We deliver a number of health related activities to encourage children, young people and families and older people in Southend to develop a healthy lifestyle and continue to stay fit.

Theme 3 - Community Cohesion

Our Cohesion department seeks to bring the diverse communities of Southend together to engage in a range of activities. We work largely with young people aged 12-19 delivering positive activities to engage people, before signposting to other projects including active citizenship, equality training and educational project work.

Theme 4 - Education

Our courses focus on reintegrating young people into learning or employment, whilst building their CVs and developing transferable Key and Life Skills that will be vital across many of the career paths that the learners choose to take.

Financial review

During the year the Trust received £431,194 income from donations, gifts, grants, sponsorship and fundraising activities. The costs of charitable activities during the year were £412,076 and governance costs were £3,035. Fund balances at 31 August 2014 were £82,909.

Reserves policy

The Trustees' reserves policy is to hold three to four months expenditure in the unrestricted reserves, however the target is to increase this to six months. The reserves are needed in the event of lost funding, unexpected costs or reduced income levels. Whilst the reserves are below this leval at 31 August 2014, it is the target of the trust to work towards achieving this level.

Statement of Trustees' responsibilities

The Trustees (who are also Directors of Southend United Community & Educational Trust for the purpose of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. - prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2014

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in the statement of financial activities for the period in which it relates. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

1.3. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred.

Charitable activities comprise of costs associated with attracting income and the costs of fundraising.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs are expenditure incurred in complying with the legal and statutory requirements.

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

16. Related party transactions

The Trust is greatly assisted by Southend United Football Club ('The Club') in being able to carry out its charitable activities, via the sharing of its significant resources. The Club and Trust share many operations resources, have Directors in common and are subject to common influence and are hence related parties.

During the year the Trust recharged expenses to the Club totalling £544 (2013: £2,602) and the Club recharged the Trust for expenses of £10,590 (2013: £7,752). The amount oustanding to the Trust at the year-end was £nil (2013: £5,150).

17. Company limited by guarantee

Southend United Community & Educational Trust is a company limited by guarantee and accordingly does not have a share capital.

Every member of the company undertakes to contribute such amount as may be required not exceeding £1 to the assets of the charitable company in the event of its being wound up while he or she is a member, or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member.
