# Principal activities and review

The principal activity of the company is that of raising funds for the benefit of Helen & Douglas House, a registered charitable company, charity number 1085951.

The results for the period show a surplus of £233,964 (2016: £171,283), which the directors have agreed will be gifted to the parent company.

# Responsibilities of the directors

The directors are responsible for preparing the directors' annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### a) Statutory information

Helen & Douglas House (Trading) Ltd is a company limited by share capital and is incorporated in the United Kingdom. The registered office address is North Bailey House, New Inn Hall Street, Oxford, OX1 2EA and principal place of business is 14A Magdalen Road, Oxford, OX4 1RW.

#### b) Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 - 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland' ('FRS 102'), and with the Companies Act 2006. The directors have taken advantage of the reduced disclosure framework exemptions as noted in FRS 102 section 1.12. The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

#### c) Going concern

The directors consider that there are no material uncertainties about the company's ability to continue as a going concern.

#### d) Income

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods and services, exclusive of VAT. Income is recognised when goods and services have been delivered to customers such that risks and rewards of ownership have transferred to them.

#### e) Inventories

Inventories have been valued at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less cost to sell. In general, cost is determined on a first in first out basis. A provision is made where necessary for obsolete, slow moving and defective stocks.

#### f) Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

#### g) Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

#### h) Creditors

Creditors are measured at the transaction price.
