GROUP STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

The directors present their strategic report of the company and the group for the year ended 31 December 2014.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The group continues to be financed by long term loans from HSBC Bank plc and during the year, cash inflows from its subsidiary have been sufficient to enable the company to meet all administrative costs and scheduled loan repayments.

The group's trading subsidiary has had a satisfactory year given the highly competitive market conditions. As expected 2014 has proved to be a period of moderate growth. Weddings have reduced in number by roughly 10% although this was partly anticipated due to the main function room being closed for planned alteration which never materialised, for three months. Spend per wedding stagnated due to competition in the marketplace. Room occupancy and revenue per room both increased significantly to more than compensate for the reduction in weddings.

Maintenance and refurbishment have been cut back in the period due to completion of refurbishment work planned in the short term.

A Sales Manager was employed throughout this period, but it has been decided to operate without one again due to the difficulty in recouping the expenses associated with this position in increased profit.

For 2015 we expect to see further growth in single figures, which, bearing in mind the large increases in trade in 2011 and 2012 we are happy to achieve. We expect wedding numbers to remain largely level, with an increase in 2016. Spend per head is also strengthening, and current levels of bookings remain strong.

Considering the challenging market conditions that remain within the hotel sector, the directors are satisfied with the position of the group at 31 December 2014.

GROUP STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Financing and interest rates

The group's primary cash inflows are generated from the subsidiary trading company, Whitley Hall Hotel Limited. That company is financed via loans from its parent undertaking, HLW 229 Ltd and also from its directors. It also has a small overdraft facility, but there is rarely a need to use this. The loans to the company are interest free, therefore, there is no exposure to interest rate risks. There is an interest rate risk attaching to the bank overdraft, but this is minimal.

The group continues to be financed by a long term bank loan, which has a further 15 years to run.

The group does not trade in financial instruments and has no other form of derivatives.

Cashflows

The primary cash inflows are derived from the groups trading company, Whitley Hall Hotel Limited. Under the current economic climate, maintaining cashflow is paramount and this will be monitored closely to ensure cashflows are sufficient to enable the group to meet its obligations.

The intention is to reduce costs, focus on core business and expand the social media profile. Efforts are being made to reduce the slowdown in wedding bookings and we expect wedding bookings to increase in 2016.

Our planning application for more bedrooms and leisure facilities has been accepted and we will give this development further consideration in 2015.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of services provided, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Freehold property

- Straight line over 99 years

Fixtures and fittings Motor vehicles Computer equipment 20% on cost20% on cost

- 33% on cost

As stated above, the depreciation policy for land and buildings is straight line over 99 years. As the estimated residual value of the land and buildings is considered to be not materially difference from its current carrying value, the calculated depreciation charge is not material.

Depreciation of assets only commences when the asset is brought into use.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The group operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the group's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.

Investments

Investments are included at the lower of cost or net recoverable amount.

Government grants

Government grants received which are of a capital nature, are recognised as deferred income in the balance sheet and then credited to the profit and loss account at the same rate as the depreciation charge of the relevant asset.

Government grants received which are of a revenue nature are credited directly to the profit and loss account.
