Directors' Report for the Year Ended 31 December 2015

The Directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2015.

Principal activity

Grove Investments UK Limited ("the Company") did not trade in the current year and preceding year. There is no immediate intertion for the Company to recommence trading.

Business review

The Company is consolidated as part of the Grove Limited group ("Group"). As the Company did not trade, the Group's business review and risks and uncertainties can be found in the Grove Limited consolidated financial statements. The Directors deem that there are no risks and uncertainties directly attributable to the Company as it is currently non-trading.

In 2013 the Company owned 23.63% of Cygnet 2008 Limited. The investment was disposed of on 29 November 2013, through gifting the investment in its entirety to employees of Cygnet 2008 Limited. In 2014 the Company received £2,703,000 as part of the sale agreement due to Cygnet 2008 Limited being sold on to external shareholders within 5 years of the gift of the investment.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2015

1 General information

The Company is a private company limited by share capital and domiciled in the UK.

2 Accounting policies

Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Statement of compliance

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'. The amendments to Financial Reporting Standard 102 issued in July 2015 and effective immediately have been applied. The presentation currency of these financial statements is sterling.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared using the historical cost convention except that as disclosed in the accounting policies certain items are shown at fair value.

No judgements have been made by the Directors, in the application of the accounting policies, that have a significant effect on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustment in the next year.

Summary of disclosure exemptions

As the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Grove Limited the Company has taken advantage of the disclosure exemptions contained in FRS 102 Section 1.12. By virtue of FRS 102 Section 33.1A the Company has not disclosed transactions or balances with wholly owned entities which form part of the Group.

Name of parent of group

These financial statements are consolidated in the financial statements of Grove Limited.

The financial statements of Grove Limited may be obtained from www.jersey.fsc.org.

Going concern

In previous years, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Company has not traded for the current or preceding year and there are no plans to recommence trade. Due to this, the financial statements have not been prepared on a going concern basis. No adjustments were necessary to the amounts at which the remaining net assets are included in these financial statements.

Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Equity instruments are measured at the fair value of the cash or other resources received or receivable, net of the direct costs of issuing the equity instruments. If payment is deferred and the time value of money is material, the initial measurement is on a present value basis.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2015 (continued)

3 Other gains and losses

In 2013 the Company held 23.63% of the ordinary share capital of Cygnet 2008 Limited. This was disposed of on 29 November 2013, through gifting the investment in its entirety to employees of the company. As part of the agreement for the gifting of the investment, contingent income could be received if the shares held in Cygnet 2008 Limited were subsequently sold onto a third party within 5 years after the date of the agreement. The Company was due 50% of the aggregate sale proceeds in excess of £1. During 2014 this event occurred and therefore the Company received £2,703,000.

4 Directors' remuneration

The Company had no employees other than Directors (2014: Nil). The Directors received remuneration for services to Grove Limited of which Grove Investments UK Limited is a subsidiary undertaking, however the propertion attributable to their services to Grove Investments UK Limited is not separately identifiable.

5 Auditor's remuneration

The remuneration of the auditor in the current year was borne by another Group Company. The estimate of this for the current year is £1,000 (2014: £4,000).

6 Taxation

The tax charge for the year is £Nil (2014: £Nil).

The tax on profit before tax for the year is the same as the standard rate of corporation tax in the UK (2014 - lower than the standard rate of corporation tax in the UK) of 20.25% (2014 - 21.49%).

Reductions in the UK corporation tax rate from 23% to 21% (effective from 1 April 2014) and 20% (effective from 1 April 2015) were substantively enacted on 2 July 2013. Further reductions to 19% (effective from 1 April 2017) and to 18% (effective 1 April 2020) were substantively enacted on 26 October 2015. This will reduce the Company's future current tax charge accordingly.
