Principal activity

The principal activity of the company is that of an investment holding company

Taxation

The current tax is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the income statement because it excludes items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items that are never taxable or deductible. The company's hability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been in force during the period.

Finance income

Finance income is accrued on a time basis by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable

Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Incremental costs directly attributable to the issue of new shares or options are shown in equity as a deduction, net of tax, from the proceeds

Fair value estimation

The carrying value less impairment provision of other current assets is assumed to approximate their fair values

Financial risk management
