The directors present their annual report on the affairs of the company, together with the audited financial statements, for the year ended 31 March 2008. Shaw healthcare Limited is a wholly owned subsidiary of Shaw healthcare (Group) Limited and the directors draw your attention to the Business Review located within the annual report of Shaw healthcare (Group) Limited.

#### Principal activities

The principal activity of the company is that of the provision of care services.

The profit and loss account for the year is set out on page 6. The loss for the year before taxation was £1,054,790 (2007: profit £1,443,571).

#### Dividends

The directors cannot recommend a dividend for the financial year (2007: £550,000).

#### Directors' responsibilities

The directors are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

## Financial risks

Most of the company's income derives from long-term contracts (20–30 years) with the public sector (NHS and local authorities) and the balance from selling care home places and services on the open market. Any shortcoming in the quality of care services places this income at risk: either because contracted income reduces if key performance indicator targets are not met or because a home with a failing reputation is unlikely to get new customers.

The main threat to quality is not being able to recruit and retain staff of sufficient calibre. This risk is managed by intensive training of all staff at every level.

#### Directors

#### Taxation status

The company is a close company under the provisions of the Taxes Act.

#### Disabled employees

The company operates a policy of equal opportunities for employment which includes disabled employees. This policy gives full and fair consideration to applications for employment to the company made by disabled persons, having regard to their particular aptitude and abilities, for continuing the employment of, and for arranging appropriate training for, employees of the company who have become disabled persons during the period when they were employed by the company and otherwise for the training, career development and promotion of disabled persons employed by the company.

#### Employee involvement

During the financial year the company continued the arrangements aimed at:

- 1. providing employees systematically with information on matters of concern to them as employees;
- 2. consulting employees or their representatives on a regular basis so that the views of the employees can be taken into account in making decisions which are likely to affect their interests;
- achieving a common awareness on the part of all employees of the financial and economic factors affecting the performance of the company.

#### Auditors

In the case of each of the persons who are directors of the company at the date when this report is approved:

- so far as each of the directors is aware, there is no relevant audit information (as defined in the Companies Act 1985) of which the company's auditors are unaware; and
- each of the directors has taken all the steps that they ought to have taken as a director to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information (as defined) and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information.

This confirmation is given and should be interpreted in accordance with the provisions of s234ZA of the Companies Act 1985.

Deloitte & Touche LLP have indicated their willingness to continue in office as the company's auditors and a resolution for their reappointment will be proposed at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting.

We have audited the financial statements of Shaw healthcare Limited for the year ended 31 March 2008 which comprise the Profit and Loss Account, the Statement of Total Recognised Gains and Losses, the Balance Sheet, and the related notes 1 to 18. These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein.

#### 1. Principal Accounting Policies

#### a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom and the Companies Act 1985. The accounting policies, which have been applied consistently throughout the current and the prior financial year, are set out below.

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention.

#### b) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation. No depreciation is provided on fixed assets as the annual depreciation rate used for freehold land is nil.

#### c) Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is provided, under the liability method, to take account of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for accounts purposes and their treatment for tax purposes. Tax deferred is accounted for in respect of all material timing differences.

#### d) Pension costs

For defined benefit schemes the amounts charged to operating (loss)/profit are the current service costs and gains and losses on settlements and curtailments. They are included as part of staff costs. Past service costs are recognised immediately in the profit and loss account if the benefits have vested. If the benefits have not vested immediately, the costs are recognised over the period until vesting occurs. The interest cost and the expected return on assets are shown as a net amount of other finance costs or credits adjacent to interest. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised immediately in the statement of total recognised gains and losses. Defined benefit schemes are funded, with the assets of the scheme held separately from those of the company, in separate trustee administered funds. Pension scheme assets are measured at fair value and liabilities are measured on an actuarial basis using the projected unit method and discounted at a rate equivalent to the current rate of return on a high quality corporate bond of equivalent currency and term to the scheme liabilities. The actuarial valuations are obtained at least triennially and are updated at each balance sheet date. The resulting defined benefit asset or liability, net of the related deferred tax, is presented separately after other net assets on the face of the balance sheet.

For defined contribution schemes the amount charged to the profit and loss account in respect of pension costs and other post-retirement benefits is the contribution payable in the year. Differences between contributions payable in the year and contributions actually paid are shown as either accruals or prepayments in the balance sheet.

# e) Liability for maintenance costs

The liability for the cost of maintenance is recognised in the accounting period in which the work is carried out.

## f) Revenue recognition

The company recognises income as care is provided for market beds, and as care is made available for block beds. It also recognises income as it is earned for care services provided to other companies in the group.

#### g) Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption under FRS1 (revised) from preparing a cash flow statement. The company is a subsidiary of Shaw healthcare (Group) Limited which prepares consolidated financial statements which include a consolidated cash flow statement. These financial statements are publicly available. The company's cash flows are included in the consolidated cash flow statement of Shaw healthcare (Group) Limited.

#### 2. Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts earned during the period, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

## 3. Exceptional item

The charge relates to a change in estimate of pension liability at 1 April 2007 in one of the pension funds to which the company contributes. The liability was not recognised at 31 March 2007 because the deficit identified could not, at the time, be accurately allocated to each employer. Subsequent to the approval of the 2007 financial statements, an actuarial valuation was carried out which has determined a deficit of assets compared with the valuation of liabilities at 1 April 2007 of £226,002. The scheme affected is the Worcestershire County Council Pension Fund.
