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DIRECTORS' REPORT for the year ended 31 August 2008

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2008.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The directors are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and the group and of the profit or loss of the group for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the group will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and the group and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and the group and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activites are the provision of land remediation, decontamination and site clearance including bulk earthworks, materials management, demolition and all associated activities.

DIRECTORS' REPORT for the year ended 31 August 2008

BUSINESS REVIEW

The financial year ending 31 August 2008 has been a disappointing year.

This is down to many factors:

- Losses in the year on old unsettled Road and Sewers contracts, which is a sector we no longer operate in.
- Bad debts from the effects of the credit crunch in these unprecedented times.
- The complete collapse of the Residential Market
- Projects due to start that have been held back as the construction market has weakened.
- · Payments in lieu of notice and redundancy costs

Overheads have been reduced dramatically to reflect the size of our business: our current overhead has been reduced to £500,000, a drop of nearly 40%.

Code started to feel the effects of the downturn very early compared to other sectors in our industry and at the time of writing our enquiry levels have doubled and we are winning work on a much improved ratio.

We now carry out more work in the public sector with our business successfully applying for inclusion on select lists and are now enjoying the fruits of our labour.

The house building market has now shown signs of improving and the large developers have started to prepare sites ready for build later in the year.

We are part of a strong diverse group and during these difficult times are benefiting from more work from our sister companies, something which has happened far less in the past.

We anticipate being able to achieve a profit even in these difficult times in the coming financial year as our business is at the front end of construction. We should therefore come out of these difficult times sooner than companies in other areas of the industry

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to £184,259 (2007 - loss £271,856).

The directors do not propose the payment of an ordinary dividend. The loss for the year is taken to reserves.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 August 2008

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

1.2 BASIS OF CONSOLIDATION

The financial statements consolidate the accounts of Code Construction Demolition plc and all of its subsidiary undertakings ('subsidiaries').

1.3 TURNOVER

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts. The policy for income recognition on long term contract work in progress is given at 1.9 below.

1.4 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Plant & machinery

25-33% reducing balance and straight line

Motor vehicles

10-25% reducing balance

Furniture, fittings and equipment -

33-50% straight line

1.5 INVESTMENTS

Investments in subsidiaries are valued at cost less provision for impairment.

1.6 LEASING AND HIRE PURCHASE

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets. Assets acquired by finance lease are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Assets acquired by hire purchase are depreciated over their useful lives. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the company. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

1.7 STOCKS

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 August 2008

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.8 DEFERRED TAXATION

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation.

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are discounted.

1.9 LONG-TERM CONTRACT WORK IN PROGRESS

Profit on long-term contracts is taken as the work is carried out if the final outcome can be assessed with reasonable certainty. The profit included is calculated on a prudent basis to reflect the proportion of the work carried out at the year end, by recording turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. Turnover is calculated as that proportion of total contract value which costs incurred to date bear to total expected costs for that contract. Revenues derived from variations on contracts are recognised only when they have been accepted by the customer. Full provision is made for losses on all contracts in the year in which they are first foreseen.

1.10 PENSIONS

The company contributes to a personal stakeholder scheme.

2. TURNOVER

The whole of the turnover is attributable to the principal activity of the company.

All turnover arose within the United Kingdom.
