Strategic Report

for the Year Ended 31 August 2019

The director presents his strategic report for the year ended 31 August 2019.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The three year summary of trading and key performance indicators are:

In 2019, the Company focused on consolidating its current customer base instead of finding new customers. MDK's presence at UB BV has strengthened the Company's links with clients in France and Germany. Whilst competition remains strong the Company has maintained its position with the major premium brands. There has been a marginal fall in sales, however, small variations can be expected depending on the timings of promotions/deliveries. Sales in the catering area have increased in the UK and overseas. Online sales continue to increase, but the overall volume percentage remains small.

The company increased both the warehouse and office sizes by 30% and continues to invest in and develop new products.

Turnover of £10,977k (2018: £11,326k) marginally fell by 3.09%.

2019-20

Considering the impact of Covid-19, the outlook for the rest of 2020 is very difficult. Up until January, business was in line with targets. However, since then both supplies and deliveries have been severely interrupted. Since the end of February, catering revenues have decreased by 90%. We expect this situation to remain throughout 2020. B2B sales have continued but at a reduced level, with orders being both cancelled and reduced. Based on current information, we expect the impact from March - August to reduce overall turnover for this period by up to 60%. The company is in a position to endure the resulting financial impact.

Financial position and liquidity

The financial position of the Company is presented in the Balance Sheet. The Company had net assets of £2,921k (2018: £2,688k), including cash of £864k (2018: £652k) at 31 August 2019.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of the supply of glassware, barware and accessories to international Spirit Brand owners and the high end catering industry with a split of approx 87% - 12% respectively.

The direct online business represents approx 1% of turnover.

DIVIDENDS

During the year ended 31 August 2019, the company paid dividends totalling £945,355.32.

DIRECTOR

N W Andrews held office during the whole of the period from 1 September 2018 to the date of this report.

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Sandbar AP Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Preparation of consolidated financial statements

The financial statements contain information about Sandbar AP Limited as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The company is exempt under Section 399(2A) of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirements to prepare consolidated financial statements.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Intangible assets

Intangible assets are initially measured at cost. After initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Development costs are being amortised evenly over their estimated useful life of five years.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery - 25% on cost and 25% on reducing balance

Motor vehicles - 25% on reducing balance

Investments in subsidiaries

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are recognised at cost.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the statement of financial position date.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the statement of financial position date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or

substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

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2. **ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued**

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the statement of financial position date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

During the year, sales totalling £517,961 were made to the subsidiary. At the balance sheet date, the amount owed from Urban

Bar BV was £339,996.
