The directors present their annual report on the affairs of the company together with the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2013.

Business review and principal activities

Following the completion of the sale of the Dentsu Aegis Network (formerly Aegis Group plc) shares to Dentsu Inc. on 26 March 2013 the ultimate parent company is Dentsu Inc.

The Company did not trade during the year. As a result, these financial statements are prepared on a basis other than going concern.

The balance sheet on page 5 of the financial statements shows the Company's financial position which consists principally of an intercompany payable to Dentsu Aegis UK Limited (formerly Aegis Media Limited) as a result of the transfer of trade and net liabilities.

There have been no significant events since the balance sheet date that require adjustment to, or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Company's directors believe that further key performance indicators for the Company are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business because it ceased trading as at 31 December 2007. The Company does not use derivative financial instruments.

Results and dividend

The result on ordinary activities after taxation for the year was £nil (2012 – £nil). The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2012 – £nil) for the year.
