- 3.4 Provide sustainable sources of revenue with which to fund the ongoing maintenance of specialist facilities and management of therapeutic treatments.
- 3.5 Enrich the life experiences of children and adults who have SEN and/or disabilities and help enable them to reach their potential.

of the Memorandum of Association be deleted and replaced with the following wording:

- The Charity's objects (the Objects) are:To advance the education of the pupils at Barrs Court School, Herefordshire
 by providing or assisting in the provision of educational, therapeutic,
 recreational and other charitable facilities not normally provided by the local
 education authority including:
 - Hydrotherapy
 - Sensory and perceptual development
 - Rebound therapy
 - Augmentative communication

- 4 In addition to any other powers it may have, the Charity has the following powers in order to further the Objects (but not for any other purpose):

 - (b) facilitate research into therapeutic treatments and promote excellence in the provision of therapeutic treatments;
 - (c) provide sustainable sources of revenue with which to fund the ongoing maintenance of specialist facilities and management of therapeutic treatments.
 - (d) enrich the life experiences of children and adults who have SEN and/or disabilities and help enable them to reach their potential;
