11. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

At 31 July 2005, De Facto 1185 Limited owed £50,000 to Ashflame Property Investments Limited. The loan was interest free.

The company was acquired by Ashflame Property Investments Limited on 28 July 2005. Prior to that date the company was owned by ntl Premium TV Holdings Corp. On 28 January 2005 the company acquired 3,665,804 10p ordinary shares in Leicester City plc (in liquidation) from its fellow subsidiary, Premium TV Limited for £1. This transfer was validated in the High Court of Justice Chancery Division Companies Court under s127 of the Insolvency Act 1986 on 12 May 2005.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS8 not to disclose transactions with other group companies, whilst it remained a wholly owned subsidiary within a consolidated group.
