Basis of audit opinion

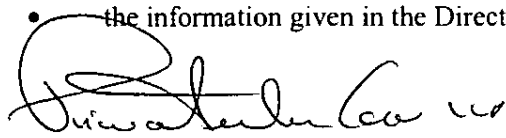

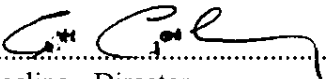

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

These accounts are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies are set out below.

Cash flow statement

Exemption has been taken from preparing a cash flow statement on the grounds that the company qualifies as a small company.

Deferred tax

Full provision is made on a non-discounted basis for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising due to timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and their recognition in the tax computation at the current rate of tax. Deferred tax assets are only recognised when it is considered more likely than not that they will be realised.

Capital losses in the company were claimed in the year ended 31 March 2006 against capital gains arising in group companies and elected to be taxed in this company. Whilst the directors believe use of the losses is supported, the eligibility of utilising these has been challenged by HMRC and the directors are therefore now uncertain as to the final outcome of related legal proceedings. If the challenge was successful, further corporation tax of £2,262,000 would arise together with related interest.

The standard rate of UK corporation tax changed to 28% with effect from 1 April 2008 and will apply to future tax charges.
