STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Risk Management

The major risks to which the charity is exposed have been reviewed and systems established to mitigate those risks. A key element in the management of financial risk has been the setting of a reserves policy and its regular review by trustees.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and activities

The objects of the charity are as follows:

- 1. to solicit, raise and provide funding in support of (and to provide benefits for) children who have suffered (whether by losing parents, or becoming homeless or otherwise), as a result of such children, or their parents or guardians contracting Aids (or other serious disease or ill-health).
- 2. to advance the public education and awareness of Aids and/or any other serious disease or threat to public health.
- 3. to relieve poverty through the provision of financial support for Aids-orphaned and homeless children.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Activities during the year

During the year under review we have received donations of £100. Administration costs amounted to £3,134. The H M Revenue & Customs enquiry into the charity's accounts for the year ended 29 February 2012 has been concluded in the the charity's favour, however this has led to the charity incurring significant accountancy costs over the last couple of years.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees have decided that there will be no significant funds held on reserve. Income reserves at 29 February 2016 were £1,936 in deficit (2015-£1,098).

Investment powers and policy

Under the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the charity has the power to invest in any way the trustees wish.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF LIGHT FROM AFRICA

I report on the accounts for the year ended 29 February 2016 set out on pages four to eight.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment

- 15% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
