Notes (forming part of the financial statements)

1 Basis of preparation - going concern

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles under the historical cost convention and comply with financial reporting standards of the Accounting Standards Board, as promulgated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales

The financial statements are prepared in UK sterling which is the reporting currency of the company

The company's ability to continue as a going concern is largely dependent on the recoverability of its receivables and the continued financial support of its parent, Ballymore Properties Limited, which in turn is a subsidiary of Ballymore Properties Holdings Limited

The recoverable amount of receivables from subsidiaries (£23 7 million) is subject to uncertainty due to the property market conditions to which the subsidiaries are exposed. However, the directors are of the opinion that the amount receivable will be recovered in the longer term when normal market conditions return and as a result, no related provision is required.

There are a number of material uncertainties which may cast doubt on the ability of the Ballymore Properties Holdings Limited group to continue as a going concern. These matters include the ability of the group to successfully repay, refinance or renew bank facilities of £1,295 million which fall due by 31 March 2010 and £7 million which falls due by 31 March 2011 and to secure continuing support from the group's bankers in the event of any breaches of covenants in a climate of deteriorating property values. While the ultimate outcome of these matters cannot be assessed with certainty at this time, nevertheless, having considered the basis of preparation and the assumptions underlying the group's cashflow projections together with assessing the current status of negotiations with the group's current lenders, the directors of the group have a reasonable expectation that the group will be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due for the foreseeable future

It is on the basis of the above factors that the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis

2 Statutory information

Audit fees are borne by another group company. The company has no employees. No emoluments are paid to the directors of the company.
