#### Report on the financial statements

#### Our opinion

In our opinion the financial statements, defined below:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs as at 4 October 2014 and of its result for the period then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice;
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

This opinion is to be read in the context of what we say in the remainder of this report.

#### What we have audited

The financial statements, which are prepared by Marston's Issuer Parent Limited, comprise:

- the balance sheet as at 4 October 2014;
- the notes to the financial statements, which include a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

#### **Accounting policies**

#### (a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The Directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

Accounting policies applied are consistent with the prior period.

The financial statements contain information about Marston's Issuer Parent Limited as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The Company is exempt under section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements as it and its subsidiary undertaking are included by full consolidation in the consolidated financial statements of Marston's PLC, a company registered in England and Wales.

#### Cash flow statement

The Company did not incur any inflows or outflows of cash during the current or prior period and hence a cash flow statement is not presented.

#### Related party transactions

There were no related party transactions in either the current or prior period.

#### (d) Investment in subsidiaries

Investments in subsidiaries are stated at cost, less any provision for permanent diminution in value.

#### Profit and loss account

The Company did not trade during the period and has made neither a profit nor a loss. No profit and loss account has therefore been prepared.

#### 3. Employees and auditors' remuneration

The average monthly number of people employed by the Company during the period excluding Directors was nil (2013: nil). The Directors received no remuneration in respect of their services to the Company (2013: £nil).

#### 9. Ultimate parent undertaking

The shares of the Company are held by Wilmington Trust SP Services (London) Limited under a declaration of trust for charitable purposes.

The Company's subsidiary, Marston's Issuer PLC, was set up with the sole purpose of issuing loan notes secured on the assets of Marston's Pubs Limited, a subsidiary of Marston's Pubs Parent Limited, which is owned by Marston's PLC. The Directors of the Company consider Marston's PLC to be the ultimate controlling party, as it has operating and financial control of the Company.

The Directors of Marston's PLC consider the Company to be a quasi-subsidiary (as defined in FRS 5/SIC 12) as it has operating and financial control of the Company. Hence the results of the Company are included in the consolidated financial statements of Marston's PLC.
