DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2008

The directors present their report and group accounts for the year ended 31 December 2008.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the company continues to be that of a holding company.

Review of business

In its third full year of trading Acre 983 has achieved significant sales growth with an increase in sales revenue of 27% on the previous year. This growth has resulted from the group's investment in new products along with the development of existing and new customer accounts.

This increase in sales has improved profitability on ordinary activities by £281,425. This is despite significant price inflation from Far East suppliers, the weakening of Sterling against US Dollar, and the global economic uncertainty that has affected the group in the last quarter of the year.

With continued focus on our new product introduction programme and further reductions in product costs by strengthening our Far East sourcing capability, we are confidently forecasting continued sales growth and improved profitability in the coming year.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

NOTES TO THE GROUP ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2008

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

1.2 Basis of consolidation

The consolidated profit and loss account and balance sheet include the accounts of the company and its subsidiary undertakings made up to 31 December 2008. The results of subsidiaries sold or acquired are included in the profit and loss account up to, or from the date control passes. Intra-group sales and profits are eliminated fully on consolidation.

1.3 Turnover

Turnover represents the invoiced value of goods sold and services provided net of VAT.

1.4 Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is amortised over a period of two years.

1.5 Research and development

Research expenditure is written off to the profit and loss account in the year in which it is incurred. Development expenditure is written off in the same way unless the directors are satisfied as to the technical, commercial and financial viability of individual projects. In this situation, the expenditure is deferred and amortised over the period during which the company is expected to benefit.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets—at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Plant and machinery

15-25% Reducing balance

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

25% Reducing balance

Motor vehicles

25% Reducing balance

1.7 Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Assets held under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are treated as if they had been purchased outright at the present value of the rentals payable, less finance charges, over the primary period of the agreements. The corresponding obligations under these agreements are included in creditors. The finance element of the rentals payable is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant rate of charge on the outstanding balance in each period.

Rental payments under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

1.8 Stock

Work in progress is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes all direct costs incurred in bringing the stocks to their present location and condition.

Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal.

NOTES TO THE GROUP ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2008

1.9 Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided in full on timing differences which result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the accounts. Deferred tax is not provided on timing differences arising from the revaluation of fixed assets where there is no commitment to sell the assets. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

1.10 Foreign currency translation

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction.

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.
