1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

Going concern

These financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes that the company will continue to trade. The validity of this assumption is dependent on the continued availability of funding from the parent company or new funding from other sources. If the company is unable to continue, adjustment may have to be made to reduce the value of assets to their recoverable amounts and provide for any further liabilities that might arise

Development costs

Costs relating to sites under investigation are charged to the profit and loss account in the year of expenditure until, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable certainty of the development proceeding. Where there is a reasonable certainty of a development proceeding related site costs are deferred under development costs in current assets until such time as planning permission is granted, after which the costs are transferred to site development costs under tangible fixed assets

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date except that the recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that the company anticipates making sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing differences.

Deferred tax balances are not discounted
