Strategic report for the year ended 30 April 2016

The Directors present their strategic report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2016.

Review of operations

The principal activity of the Company is to hold an investment in a subsidiary company, Rocco Forte & Family (Luxury Hotels) GmbH. This subsidiary leases Villa Kennedy in Frankfurt and holds an investment in Rocco Forte & Family (Munich) GmbH which leases The Charles Hotel in Munich. The Directors are optimistic regarding the future performance of these properties.

The loss for the year after taxation was £6,427 (2015 – Profit of £32,642).

In addition to regular review of the financial performance of the hotels, the Directors closely monitor a number of performance indicators alongside the financial results. These include the rate and occupancy performance of the hotels compared to their local competitive sets, independent assessments of service quality against operational service standards, direct research with customers, comment cards and online feedback direct to the hotel or through the feedback website.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The Directors consider the following to be the principal risks and uncertainties facing the Company:

- Exchange and interest rate exposure; and
- The impact of global issues such as recession and conflicts on the performance of the Company's investments.

Change in accounting framework

The Company has adopted Financial Reporting Standards 101 "Reduced Disclosure Framework" (FRS 101) for the first time this year. In previous years, the Company has applied applicable UK accounting standards (UK GAAP). The impact of this change is described in note 10.

Results and dividends

The loss for the year after taxation was £6,427 (2015 – Profit of £32,642). The Directors do not propose the payment of a dividend (2015 - £Nil).

Financial risk management

The main financial risks faced by the Company relate to interest rates and foreign currency. These risks are managed at a Group level, under the control of the Chief Financial Officer and within policies approved by the Board. The Group's financial risk management objective is broadly to seek to make neither profit nor loss from exposure to these risks.

Notes forming part of the financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2016

1 Accounting policies

Statement of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework ("FRS 101"). The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. The policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis. The presentation currency used is pound sterling and amounts have been presented in round thousands ("£000s").

These are the Company's first financial statements prepared in accordance with FRS 101. The date of transition is 1 May 2014. In previous years the financial statements were prepared in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards (UK GAAP). An explanation of how the transition to FRS 101 from UK GAAP has affected the reported financial position of the company is provided in note 10.

The Company's ultimate parent company, Rocco Forte Hotels Limited, includes the Company in its consolidated financial statements. The consolidated financial statements of Rocco Forte Hotels Limited, which is incorporated in the UK, are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU and are publically available.

In preparing the financial statements the company has taken advantage of all disclosure exemptions conferred by FRS 101. Therefore the following disclosures have not been provided:

- A statement of cashflows
- Certain comparative information as otherwise required by EU endorsed IFRS
- Disclosure of related party transactions with other wholly owned members of the group headed by Rocco Forte Hotels Limited.
- Certain financial instruments disclosures as disclosed in the consolidated Rocco Forte Hotels Limited financial statements.

Going concern

The Company reports net current liabilities, net liabilities and losses for the year and therefore relies on financial support from its parent company, Rocco Forte & Family (Luxury Hotels) Limited. The parent company has indicated that it will not require repayment of intercompany loans before 31 January 2020 to ensure the Company can meet all liabilities as they fall due for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Exemption from preparation of group accounts

The financial statements contain information about Rocco Forte & Family (Luxury Hotels) (Germany) Limited as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The company has taken advantage of the exemption conferred by section 401 of the Companies Act 2006 not to produce consolidated financial statements as it is included in the consolidated accounts of a larger group.

Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are carried at cost less impairment. The carrying amount is reviewed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If such impairment exists, then the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised in the profit and loss statement.

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Amounts due from and amounts due to Group subsidiaries

Amounts due from and amounts due to Group subsidiaries are initially recognised at fair value. Subsequent to initial recognition they are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses. The carrying value is reviewed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. Impairment losses are recognised in the profit and loss statement.

Foreign currency

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated to the Company's functional currency at the exchange rates ruling on the dates of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are retranslated to functional currency at the relevant rates of exchange ruling on the last day of the period. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the profit and loss statement. Non monetary assets and liabilities that are measured in terms of historical cost in foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the dates of the transactions.

Income and Expenses

Interest receivable and payable is recognised in the profit and loss statement as it accrues, using the effective interest rate method.

Taxation

Current tax

Current income tax assets and liabilities for the current and prior periods are measured at the amount expected to be recovered from or paid to the tax authorities including interest. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted at the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognised in respect of temporary differences between the tax base and carrying value of assets and liabilities. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as probable that the deductible temporary differences can be realised. The recoverability of all deferred tax assets is re-assessed at the end of each reporting period. Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the asset or liability will be settled, based on rates enacted or substantively enacted at the end of the reporting period.

Critical accounting estimates and assumptions

The company makes certain estimates and assumptions regarding the future. Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. In the future, actual experience may differ from these estimates and assumptions. The estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

Impairment testing

Investments and debtors are tested for impairment when events or circumstances indicate that their carrying value may not be recoverable.

The recoverable amount is determined based on value in use calculations. The use of this method requires the estimation of future cash flows and the choice of a discount rate in order to calculate the present value of the cash flows. Information on the discount rates and key judgements are included in note 3 to the consolidated financial statements of Rocco Forte Hotels Limited. No impairment was identified for the year ended 30 April 2016.

2 (Loss) / profit on ordinary activities before taxation

Auditor's remuneration for audit services of the Company for the year of £4,000 (2015 - £4,000) and tax compliance fees of £775 (2015 - £750) have been borne by its ultimate parent company, Rocco Forte Hotels Limited.

The Company had no employees during the year and the prior year. The Directors received no remuneration in respect of services provided to the Company during the year (2015 - £Nil).

3 Tax on (loss) / profit on ordinary activities

There is no tax payable in 2016 (2015 - £Nil).

There are no deferred tax assets or liabilities as at 30 April 2016 (2015 - £Nil).

7 Called up share capital and reserves

The following describes the nature and purpose of each reserve within equity.

Share Capital - Nominal value of share capital subscribed for. The Company has one ordinary share of £1 in issue.

Profit and loss account - All net gains and losses and transactions with owners (dividends).

8 Contingent liabilities

The Company is party to a group loan facility over which the Group's bankers have a cross guarantee secured by way of a fixed and floating charge on the assets of certain group companies. The amount outstanding on this facility at 30 April 2016 was £119,798,912 (2015 - £115,143,283).

9 Ultimate parent company and controlling party

At the year end the Company's immediate parent is Rocco Forte & Family (Luxury Hotels) Limited. Rocco Forte Hotels Limited is the ultimate parent company and is the only group in which the results of the Company are consolidated. Copies of the Group financial statements of Rocco Forte Hotels Limited are publicly available.

The Hon Sir Rocco J V Forte, a Director of Rocco Forte Hotels Limited, and members of his close family control the Company as a result of controlling directly or indirectly 76% of the issued share capital of Rocco Forte Hotels Limited (2015 - 76%).

10 First time adoption of FRS 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework

This is the first time that the company has adopted FRS 101 having previously applied applicable UK accounting standards.

The date of transition to FRS 101 was 1 May 2014.

Previously UK GAAP allowed the company to re-translate the investment at the balance sheet date as if it were a monetary item and exchange differences on the shares were taken to foreign exchange reserves. There is no equivalent treatment allowed under FRS 101. In applying FRS 101 for the first time the company's opening cost of investments in subsidiary companies has been taken as deemed cost. The investment has therefore been restated to the carrying value at date of transition to FRS 101 and the foreign currency reserve deemed to be zero as at 1 May 2014. This investment was fully impaired as at 1 May 2014 and therefore impairment allowance was also restated and there was no change to net assets. In 2015, the investment allowance was reversed and the amount has been restated at the exchange rate at transition. Details of the impacts are as follows.
