OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Report of the Trustee Directors
For the year ended 30th September 2009

The objects of the Society, in the governing Memorandum, are:

- 1. To secure the preservation, protection, development and improvement of features of general public amenity or historic or public interest in the area of benefit or adjacent areas. (The area of benefit is the ecclesiastical parish of Knowle)
- 2. To educate the public in the geography, history, natural history and architecture of the area of benefit.
- 3. To promote a high standard of planning and architecture in or affecting the area of benefit and to oppose any inappropriate developments.

These objects have been achieved, largely, through the work of committees viz: Planning, Community Services, Environment, Local History, Meetings and Social and Walks. Information on the Society's activities has been publicised through the Newsletter, the Society's Website and the local media. Our involvement with the Festival in the Park and in the switching on of the Christmas Lights in the High Street have been well supported and widely appreciated

Several of our Committees maintain close contacts with a number of local organisations and bodies. These include Solihull M.B.C., the Police, Public Transport providers, Birmingham Airport and the local traders. This ensures that the views of the Society are heard in all relevant activities so fulfilling the mission of the Society to maintain the character of the village.

The Local History committee also maintains contact with appropriate organisations. It manages, on behalf of the Trustee Directors, a collection of documents and artefacts relating to the village and also arranges regular exhibitions of local interest in the Committee's Centre in Knowle Library.

The Meetings and Social and the Walks committees arranged well supported programmes of talks and walks throughout the year.

In addition to these ongoing activities the Planning Committee has been particularly busy this year considering proposals for two new supermarkets locally and also for the provision of berthing facilities on the local canal. Regular contact is maintained with the Solihull Council's Planning Department and representations made to the Council when appropriate. The Trustee Directors are also grateful for the advice and assistance given to the Society by the local Councillors on planning and other matters

We continue to be an active participant in the Knowle Green Community Project. This involves the redevelopment of the former toilet block at the junction of Station Road and the High Street. Plans are currently being drawn up for consideration by the various parties involved and to enable the necessary (and substantial) funding to be obtained. We have also been heavily involved in the Safer Routes to School scheme involving the pupils of Arden School. These plans caused much controversy and the Society arranged a public meeting so that local residents could meet the Officers of the local authority to discuss the plans. In the event the decision reached by the Council to implement only part of the scheme was considered to be a fair one in all the circumstances.

The Trustee Directors, through the committee Chairmen, carry out an annual risk assessment to ensure that all possible steps are taken to minimise risks to the Society's assets and to those who take part in our activities.

The Reserves Policy of the Society is that sufficient funds are retained to cover a minimum of an average year's expenditure. It will be seen that the Reserves at present represent more than two years' average expenditure. The reasons for this are explained in Note 8 on page 11.

Gifts in Kind. The Trustee Directors and many other volunteers freely give of their time and respective expertise. It is not considered meaningful to place an accurate value on this gift.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of The Knowle Society

I report on the accounts for the year ended 30 September 2009 set out on pages six to eleven.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation
