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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30th September 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30th September 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the Society, in the governing Memorandum, are:

o to secure the preservation, protection, development and improvement of features of general public amenity or historic or public interest in the area of benefit or adjacent areas;

o to educate the public in the geography, history, natural history and architecture of the area of benefit;

o to preserve the character of the area of benefit as a thriving community;

o to promote a high standard of planning and architecture in or affecting the area of benefit, and to oppose any inappropriate developments;

o to represent the views of the members to local and other authorities;

o to help foster community spirit by arranging lectures, social events and other appropriate activities.

The Trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

These objectives have been achieved largely through the work of the committees; Planning, Community Services, Local History, Meetings & Social and Walks and Natural Environment. Information on the Society's activities has been publicised through the Newsletter, the Website and social media.

With the completion of the Neighbourhood Forum's proposed Neighbourhood Plan and its hoped-for Council agreement and subsequent ratification by Referendum, many of the points which have been made by this Committee to appropriate applications will carry much more 'weight' in these responses. The end result, therefore, should a more even-handed system in dealings with the Council's planning department.

Natural Environment Committee

The £1000 received from Tesco has been used to improve the walkways in the Local Nature Reserve, to buy some bird boxes and to buy native wildflowers. In October 2017 we were alerted to the felling of many fine trees at Lansdowne House and, together with the Neighbourhood Forum, were successful in persuading SMBC to place a Tree Preservation Order on many of the remaining trees.

Community and Business Liaison maintains close relationship with Arden Academy and it also maintains contacts with many local traders. Arden Academy has been in receipt of our annual cheque of £250 that is awarded for the pupil who has done the most in the community.

Library

It has been another busy year in the library which, with the help of 24 volunteers, has seen over 8,500 visitors since 2011. In partnership with the Libraries department of Solihull Council, a project was initiated to develop the courtyard of the local Library, the Grade II* listed Chester House, to create a community events space that celebrates the village conservation area and heritage. A feasibility study has been undertaken and a fundraising plan is being developed.

Community Events Programmes

A well-supported programme of talks and walks occurred throughout the year. Our involvement with arrangements for the switching on of the Christmas Lights in the High Street was again well supported and widely appreciated. A quiz to raise funds for the local football club's storm damaged clubhouse rebuilding appeal was also held.

Website and newsletter

The website at www.knowlesociety.org.uk has been updated this year to include a searchable database of artefacts held in the library local history centre. In addition to its quarterly Members Newsletter, the Society continues to make use of social media and direct emailing to keep Members up to date with Society events and other village activities.

Financial results for the Year

The year ending September 30th 2018 has been steady with an excess of expenditure over income of £623.

Other project expenditure included renovation costs of £2,500 for the BT telephone box, now owned by the society, £1,960 for the Owl carving in the Knot Garden, and £1,650 finalising the legal fees for the Village Greens Appeal.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Financial aims for the forthcoming year

The 2017-18 accounting year began with £14,403 held in the general fund, with the remainder in restricted funds.

Methods used to recruit and appoint new charity trustees

The Trustee Directors may at any time co-opt a member who is qualified to be appointed as an Ordinary Trustee Director to take office until the next AGM, upon which, if elected at the AGM may serve for a period of three years. A retiring Trustee Director who remains qualified may stand for re-election at an AGM. Officers of the Society (Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer) are elected by members at the AGM.

Community Services Committee

The Community Services Committee continues to maintain close contacts with Solihull M.B.C., the Police, Public Transport providers, and the Airport to ensure that the views of the Society are heard in all relevant areas. We have continued with the help of volunteers to tidy up the raised flower beds and undertake litter picking around the village.

We have also been actively involved together with local Councillors and Traders with the Council's recent decision to change their pricing structure for the use of the public car parks and continue to monitor the resultant impact to the local economy of the Village. It is intended this monitoring will continue coupled to consequent representations being made to the Council as necessary.

Local History Committee

In addition to ongoing work this year, the Local History Committee has presented four exhibitions: 'Knowle Hall', 'Law & Order' in Knowle, 'Henry Tonks' and the present exhibition 'Centenary of End of WWI which will finish in January. Next year's exhibitions have not yet been finalised.

In July, together with the deputy chairman, Trustee Director Dave Pinwell, an event was organised to celebrate 50 years since Knowle village was given conservation status. There were guided walks, climbs up to the top of the church tower, afternoon tea in the Guild House and an exhibition of photographs of old/new buildings. The event included the primary school organising a painting/writing competition of the children's favourite buildings. The Mayor attended to give prizes out to the competition winners.

The committee was involved in the refurbishment and extension of the War Memorial in Knowle, and was comprised of Janet Erzen (LHC chair) and Peter Ewin (LHC committee), Bill Bohanna - the previous Knowle Society Chairman, with three members of the Knowle branch of the British Legion, three members of Knowle Parish Church, a retired local GP, and a local builder who gave his services for free, as did a local architect. The project began in February 2017 ready for the 11th of November 2018.

As usual, local artist Mike Humphreys painted a village scene for us to use as Christmas cards, from which 1,500 were printed. The Local History Committee then packed 6 cards and envelopes into cello bags to be sold in the Christmas Charity Card shop in Knowle Library. The profits will be donated to 'Fisher House', Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Birmingham.

Planning Committee

The Planning Committee, as part of its continuing monitoring process of the weekly Council-issue of planning applications received for Knowle, has made many responses to the appropriate applications. However, from the 'success' rate achieved, it seems the system at present tends to favour the applicant.

Membership

Membership on 30th September 2018 stood at 3058; a reduction of 108 on the previous year, mostly arising from deaths or members moving away. Income from subscriptions was slightly down from last year reflecting the lower membership numbers.

Reserves Policy

The general fund balance on 30th September 2018 was close to our normal annual expenditure.

The Reserves Policy of the Society is that sufficient funds are retained to cover a minimum of one year's normal expenditure. The end of year balance was comfortably above that level.

Full set of accounts

The full set of accounts will be available in due course by request from the Treasurer, on the Society's website or at the AGM in February 2019.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
