### Trustees Annual report for the year ended 31st August 2017

We are delighted to say our project 'Coming in from the Cold 'was a major success in a very difficult and very cold winter for many people in Liverpool. Through direct contact with homeless, disadvantaged, those addicted to drugs and alcohol, we were able to not only offer more respite from the cold and isolation and the feeling of abandonment, but we managed to get several of the participants totally back on track.

Some of the men have now turned their lives around. Achieving amazing changes in such a short time, in some cases getting secured accommodation, help with benefits claims, returning to their family and starting the long process of removing themselves from addictions.

Moreover, several have now changed diet and hygiene routines and others have led football and sports training through Health Through Sport.

We are still an accredited centre for Open awards Football Coaching Level 1 and 2 qualifications and we will know shortly who has gained their Level 1 qualification from our recent Football Coaching course.

We are still positively affecting lives of many vulnerable and disadvantaged young people, former drug misusers and ex-offenders. We help bolster their confidence, self-esteem, fitness and wellbeing, through our Football Coaching courses.

We arranged 2 Sportspersons Dinners last year and I would like to thank everyone who supported the Dinners and attended. We presented our Alan Ball 'Ball of Fire 'award and also the Brian Labone' Corinthian 'award to individuals who have led by example in the community.

The first 'Howard Kendall Achievement 'award was awarded in May and will be presented annually.

Health Through Sport were delighted to have sponsored the Walking Football Tournament in Netherton, which was organised by the Liverpool County FA but especially with the help and hard work put in by Stu Carrington.

I want to congratulate all the players, managers and coaches who took part in the tournament for their enthusiasm and attitude.

Myself, Lily Kendall, our patron, and John Bailey presented the Trophies and medals to the players. We hope to be working closely with the Liverpool County FA on other projects we are undertaking in the future.

Thanks, must again go to the Mayor of Liverpool, Mr Joe Anderson, Liverpool CVS, Awards for All, Barclays and Big Lottery.

#### 1 Statutory information

#### 2 Compliance with accounting standards
