Report of the Directors

The directors submit their report and accounts for the year ended 30 June 2005.

Status of the company and principal activities

The company is registered under the Companies Act 1985 as a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The Directors are all volunteers and the company has no paid employee.

Directors

The directors at 31 March 2006, all of whom acted throughout the year, are listed **on page 1** as the Board of Management.

The Management Committee's structure is governed by the Memorandum and Articles of Association and is subject to the election at the Partnerships AGM each year. The Directors are elected by the Management Committee at the first committee meeting following the AGM.

Review of the year

The Directors are pleased with developments made to date, in this the first year as a company. Projects covering issues such as the young, the elderly, transport, and the production of new sports facilities proceed to plan and budget. The Directors are currently reviewing the Business Plan and are due to undertake a new round of public consultation.

Results for the year

Details of the results for the year are set out in the Statement of Financial Activities on page 4.

Fixed assets

The Partnership has no fixed assets.

Reserves policy

The partnership's primary objective is undertaking projects that will provide services or amenities for the community. No commitments are made to those individual projects until the funding required is secured and then the project is carried out to an agreed budget within the funds available.

The general administration of the partnership is primarily funded through a variety of grants secured from Public Bodies. The Boards intention is to ensure that the general reserve is sufficient to finance the following years running costs.

Taxation status

In the opinion of the directors the Company is exempt from taxation in respect of its income.

Investment policy

The directors do not consider it prudent to invest in anything other than very low risk investments. Cash required for operational purposes is held in an ordinary bank current account. Funds not needed immediately are transferred to an interest bearing bank deposit account.

Statement of director's responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare accounts for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company as at the end of that period and of the surplus or deficit of the Company for that period. In preparing those accounts the directors are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- Make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed:
- State whether applicable statements of recommended practice have been followed; and
- Prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in the foreseeable future.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and which enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with relevant legislation. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
