The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the audited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2008.

REFERENCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE DETAILS

Reference and administrative details are shown in the schedule of members of the board and professional advisers on page 2 of the financial statements.

THE TRUSTEES

The trustees who served the charity during the period were as follows:

The trustees guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £10 each to the assets of the charitable company in the event of winding up.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee and was incorporated on 25 October 2005. It is governed by its memorandum and articles of association.

Appointment of trustees

Trustees are invited to join the board by invitation of the members.

Trustee training and induction

There have been no new trustees this year. In the event that new trustees are appointed they will be offered appropriate training and induction based on their level of experience.

Risks and uncertainties and risk management

The major risks to which the charity is exposed include the following:

- a. Funding: This is kept under strict review and monitoring. The Trustees direct much of their attention towards the raising of funds and cashflow. They are directly assisted in this by external paid book-keeping accountants who produce very regular financial reports for this purpose. Nearly all services for the charity are engaged by way of consultancy agreements which enable the Charity to reduce its outgoings at short notice.
- b. Operations: The trustees keep regular contact with the paid and voluntary workers for the charity and its subsidiary trading company. They are involved in all key strategic and policy decisions.

The Trustees continue to keep all the charity's activities under review, particularly with regard to major risks that may arise. Risks are mitigated by appropriate means, including insurance cover, where appropriate. For example, the Charity has a £10m employer's liability policy in place.

Organisational structure

The Charity has 3 trustees who have been selected for their particular expertise and knowledge. The activities of the charity are under the overall management and supervision of the Trustees who meet on a regular basis to review the operation of the charity and its finances. The operations of the charity are divided into 3 areas:

Xt3.com, the Christian Social Network, the Parish, Chaplaincy and Diocesan Website Initiative, and Kristos Publishing (formerly Xt3 Publishing).

The Xt3.com project is carried out by the Charity's trading subsidiary and is closely supervised by a project board, made up of 2 trustees and key personnel appointed for their relevant expertise. In turn the project has a project director and a project manager. Under them, further consultants and third parties with the appropriate expertise, experience and knowledge are engaged to execute the project.

The Parish, Chaplaincy and Diocesan Website service is under the direct supervision of one trustee. It has one consultant working on the project and a third party service provider as well as receiving voluntary help. Regular reports are compiled and reviewed by the relevant trustee who is responsible for this service.

Kristos Publishing which publishes 2 books and supports its author's work in schools and parishes has limited day to day activity which is mostly confined to arranging the distribution of the book in bookshops and on the author's tours. This activity is under the supervision of a trustee and regular reports are made of this to the trustees.

The trustees meet regularly and at least 4 times per year. They are also in regular informal contact by email and phone to review the activities of the charity and those of its trading subsidiary as a whole.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Principal activities

Our mission is to help renew the Church by creating a positive alternative Christian culture.

Objects of the charity

Kristos Media intends:

- The advancement of the Christian faith and values and;
- The advancement of education of young people through and in the provision of all types of media including, but not limited to, music, art, the written word, radio, television and the internet throughout the world.

Significant activities

At the year end Kristos Media intended to continue developing the following 3 core activities:

- Xt3.com (Website) Youth Social Network and broadcast platform designed to appeal to the interactive and creative desires of the young.
- Parish, Chaplaincy and Diocesan Websites Provision of a high quality website on a donation only basis.
- Kristos Publishing organises John Pridmore tours and distribution of his book "Gangland to Promised Land" and "Gangster's guide to God".

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Xt3.com (Website)

Following the extraordinary progress that was made in the previous year, after detailed and protracted negotiations with the organisers of World Youth Day Sydney 2008, Kristos Media, entered into an agreement dated 21 August 2007 with WYD 2008 ACN 118 060 987 as the Trustee for The World Youth Day 2008 Trust ABN 73 422 698 032 (WYD 2008), to provide the official social network for World Youth Day 2008 to be held in Sydney. World Youth Day is the largest Christian gathering of young people in the world and over 250,000 young people were expected to be in Sydney in July 2008. It was hoped that the social network would become the instrument for fulfilling the objects of the Charity.

By 31 October 2007, significant progress was made for the delivery of this site. By an agreement dated 10 September 2007, between Kristos Media and Kristos Media Trading Ltd, the trustees decided to fulfil this contract through Kristos Media Trading Limited and to make payments to Kristos Media Trading Ltd for this primary purpose.

Key personnel were recruited in order to execute this project in the limited time frame for its delivery including a specialist web developing company, Sense Internet Ltd, based in Leeds. A project board was formed in order to oversee the delivery of the site and to ensure that it was properly funded and managed.

Xt3.com was re-launched on 12 June 2008 at Telstra headquarters in Sydney by Cardinal George Pell, Archbishop of Sydney to critical acclaim both in terms of its content and its functionality. It provided social networking facilities, online resources and also a TV broadcast platform. As a result of this publicity and the huge number attending World Youth Day Sydney with Pope Benedict XVI in July 2008, the network quickly acquired members which rose in time to nearly 50,000 registered users. It enabled young people to connect with each other, share their experiences and make plans to build a better world. On 8 September 2008, Xt3.com became the first social network to be used by any Pope to convey a message to young people.

Kristos Media continued to work closely with the Archdiocese of Sydney and Cardinal Pell after World Youth Day and at the close of the financial year both parties had committed themselves to signing a further agreement by the end of the year to expand and support the site.

Parish Website Initiative

This exciting project was launched in the autumn of 2006. This Initiative registered an increase of 15 new live parish websites during the tax year 2007-08, which represented a 68% increase year on year bringing the total to 39 live websites since the project was launched. The retention rate since the launch of the project in June 2006 continued to register 100%. Donation renewal rates also registered 100% for years one and two.

The first ever custom built website for the RC Diocese of Lancaster went live in October 2008.

Kristos Publishing (John Pridmore tours)

Since 2004 we have distributed well over 70,000 books. John Pridmore has also been on ITV, the Jeremy Vine show on Radio 2, Radio 5 Live and Radio 4 and most recently on Good Morning Sunday on Radio 2. His book is now widely available in mainstream retail bookstores.

In November 2007, his second book "Gangster's guide to God" was launched at Westminster Cathedral, London in the presence of Cardinal Cormac Murphy-O'Connor, Archbishop of Westminster.

Further strides in the promotion and distribution of John Pridmore's books have been made during the current year with John Pridmore making speaker trips to the US, Australia and New Zealand. An extraordinary opportunity was made available to John Pridmore to speak in Sydney during the World Youth Day celebrations in July 2008 when he spoke to over 300,000 people and received global promotion of his book. In this year John Pridmore has also been involved in continuous speaker engagements in schools, parishes and other venues and has been interviewed widely in the press, TV and radio.

An agreement was signed with a successful French publisher, Presses de la Renaissance, to publish the book in its 2009/2010 roster and talks were initiated with an agent in Italy to explore possibilities for an Italian version.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity is reliant upon donations raised from individuals, grant making trusts and other organisations that are supportive of its objectives. These have yet to return a surplus but in time it is hoped that they will. The charity does not have any investments, besides its subsidiary company.

Level of Incoming Resources for year

The charity was successful in raising the amounts stated in the accounts which have been mostly donated and used for the purpose of the execution of the Xt3.com project. Much of the money raised has been for specific projects or areas of work including the development of Xt3.com (its social networking site), its parish website initiative and its publishing of books. It also received a grant for management of the charity and its operations.

In total the charity has received the sum of £767,486 by way of £757,693 in donations, £2,285 in donations from parishes for websites, £6,515 for retail sales of books, miscellaneous income of £305 and investment income of £688. In the previous year the charity has received the sum of £166,661 by way of £138,218 in donations, £7,082 in donations from parishes for websites, £13,142 in book donations, £879 for retail sales of books and miscellaneous income of £7,340.

Level of Expenditure for year

As a result of the significant increase in donations, the group has been able to increase the amount spent on its activities to a total sum of £1,318,778 compared to £118,001 the year before.

Net result for year

This year saw a deficit of £551,292 for the group. While a deficit was recorded, the increase in the scope of the charity's activities provided the explanation for this and it is hoped that the following financial year will see this position rectified.

Level of reserves

At 31 October 2008, there was a deficit on reserves of £529,583, with a surplus of £42,333 on the restricted reserve and a deficit of £571,916 on the unrestricted reserve. The deficit is due to the increase in the scope of the charity's activities and it is hoped that the following financial year will see this position rectified.

The charity's aim is to hold 3 months worth of expenditure, but the trustees recognise that with a young charity, this target may sometimes have to be reduced. The charity has a number of supporters on whom it can call in the event that funds fall below this level.

The charity has interest free loans of £371,525 which are repayable as and when funds allow from unrestricted income. Accordingly, the trustees consider that the charity has sufficient funds to meet its reserves criteria.

Primary purpose activity undertaken by the charity's trading company

The trustees decided to carry out the World Youth Day Social networking agreement through the charity's trading company, Kristos Media Trading Limited (formerly Xt3 Media Trading Ltd), and executed a document which directed that monies transferred to the trading company were to be used to carry out this primary purpose of the charity. Pursuant to this, the sum of £1,053,649 was transferred to the trading company for this purpose.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Xt3.com

Having launched Xt3.com in June, Kristos Media continued to work closely with the Archdiocese of Sydney and Cardinal Pell after World Youth Day and at the close of the financial year both parties had committed themselves to signing a further agreement by the end of the year to expand and support the site throughout the Church.

Following the signature of the new agreement with the Archdiocese of Sydney in December 2008, further discussions were entered into between the parties. It became clear to the Trustees that the ongoing success of Xt3.com and therefore the fulfilment of the objects of the charity were best ensured by the transfer of Xt3.com to

the Archdiocese of Sydney who were willing, ready and able to fund the project on an ongoing and permanent basis and were committed to promoting and expanding its use throughout the Church under the personal sponsorship of Cardinal Pell of Sydney. Accordingly, an assignment dated 5 August 2009 was executed in favour of the Archdiocese of Sydney. In consideration of this assignment, an outstanding loan of AU\$150,000, which had been made to the group by the Archdiocese of Sydney after the 2008 year end, together with any interest was cancelled. In order to avoid confusion between Xt3.com and the other activities of the Charity, the Trustees agreed to change the name to Kristos Media which took place on 3 September 2009.

Parish Websites

The Trustees noted the considerable effort which is required in turning interest of parishes into live parish websites. Nevertheless, the feedback of those parishes who have commissioned a website is universally positive. It is clearly assisting parishes to connect both with each other and the wider community. The Trustees are encouraged by the expansion of the initiative this year together with the 100% retention rate. It is hoped that this will continue to flourish.

John Pridmore

Having successfully published John Pridmore's second book, "A Gangster's Guide to God" in November 2007 and signed an agreement with the French publisher Presses de la Renaissance, the Trustees intend to facilitate where practicable further expansion of sales and distribution of both books.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- a. select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- b. make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- c. prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Companies Act 1985. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985.

At the year end the group had net current liabilities of £591,920 and net liabilities of £529,583. Of the creditors outstanding at the year end, £371,525 of the balance represented loans to the charity which were given on a philanthropic, interest free basis on the understanding that they would be repayable at the discretion of the trustees as and when and if sufficient unrestricted income was available to do so. A further £318,378 of creditors at year end was trade creditors, mainly in relation to the setting up of the Xt3.com website. Since the year end further donations of around £400,000 including Gift Aid have been received by the charity. In addition, the charity has a number of supporters on whom it can call in the event that additional funds are required. As noted in note 21, since the year end the Xt3.com website has been transferred to the Archdiocese of Sydney. Following this transfer it is expected that the group's activities will be much reduced in the coming year. On this basis the trustees have prepared the accounts on the going concern basis.

GROUP FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

These financial statements consolidate the results of the charity and its wholly owned subsidiary Kristos Media Trading Limited (formerly Xt3 Media Trading Limited) on a line by line basis. A separate statement of financial activities and income and expenditure account are not presented by the charity itself following the exemptions afforded by section 230 of the Companies Act 1985 and paragraph 397 of the SORP.

CASH FLOW STATEMENT

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small.

INCOMING RESOURCES

Incoming resources are recognised in accordance with Charities SORP 2005.

RESOURCES EXPENDED

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis, and are recognised when there is a legal or constructive obligation to pay for expenditure.

All costs are directly attributed to the applicable cost heading.

Costs of generating funds

These comprise the costs associated with generating income and raising the profile of the charity.

Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries.

Governance costs

These are those costs incurred by the charity in meeting its statutory obligations and include accountancy fees and legal fees.

20 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Included in other creditors is a loan from ATG UV Technology Ltd, a company 95% of which is owned by a trustee, Christopher Purslow. The balance at the year end was £62,000 (2007 - £12,000). This loan is unsecured and has been given on an interest-free basis.

All the related party transactions were approved by independent trustees as required by the charity's governing document.

TRUSTEES' REIMBURSED EXPENSES

Paul Moore, a trustee, was reimbursed expenses of £18,459 in the year.

21 POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

Following the signature of the new agreement with the Archdiocese of Sydney in December 2008, further discussions were entered into between the parties. It became clear to the Trustees that the ongoing success of Xt3.com and therefore the fulfilment of the objects of the charity were best ensured by the transfer of Xt3.com to the Archdiocese of Sydney who were willing, ready and able to fund the project on an ongoing and permanent basis and were committed to promoting and expanding its use throughout the Church under the personal sponsorship of Cardinal Pell of Sydney. Accordingly, an assignment dated 5 August 2009 was executed in favour of the Archdiocese of Sydney. In consideration of this assignment, an outstanding loan of AU\$150,000, which had been made to the group by the Archdiocese of Sydney after the 2008 year end, together with any interest was cancelled. In order to avoid confusion between Xt3.com and the other activities of the Charity, the Trustees agreed to change the name to Kristos Media which took place on 3 September 2009.
