#### **OBJECTIVES AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITES**

The Brighton & Hove Food Partnership (BHFP) is a not-for-profit organisation that works across the community to strengthen the growth and development of a sustainable local food system which creates social equity, economic prosperity, environmental sustainability, global fair-trade and improves the health and well-being of all residents. We operate a membership structure open to anyone who lives or works in Brighton & Hove

## The Brighton & Hove Food Partnership works to

- Promote the benefits of a healthy, sustainable and ethical local food system
- Encourage healthier and sustainable lifestyles by providing practical training, education, information and support on nutrition, cookery, food growing, health and wellbeing
- Co-ordinate a strategic approach to food work in the city, bringing together community organisations, statutory agencies, local businesses and individual residents

We are aiming for a sustainable food system – one that is healthy, respects environmental limits and supports a vibrant farming and food economy

In particular, we work for

- More locally produced food
- Better access to affordable, fresh, seasonal food
- More opportunities for people to learn to cook and grow food
- An increased understanding of the links between food and health
- A better understanding of where our food comes from
- An increased enjoyment of and respect for food

City Food News We produce a quarterly newsletter which reports on current food, health and environmental issues, as well as local food work, events, courses and more All Food Partnership members receive a free copy Community Cookery Project We want people to know how to cook healthy, seasonal, affordable food Our community cookery team works with individuals and groups to give people the skills and confidence to do this Harvest Brighton & Hove We are the lead partner on Harvest Brighton & Hove, a project that aims to prove that a city can grow more of its own food by encouraging more growing on allotments, gardens, parks, in vacant land around public buildings and on housing estates We run courses on growing at home and support volunteering on growing projects

Community Nutrition Service We deliver a range of community-based healthy living programmes, including weight management for adults and children. We run a healthy weight referral service used by GPs and other health and social care professionals. We also deliver training on food and nutrition and obesity awareness. Local food We promote opportunities for people to buy local food and support the development of more local food businesses.

Community food projects Brighton & Hove is home to many community food projects and we believe they are a vital part of our city. We support them with advice, information and networking opportunities. We also run a small grants scheme to support projects that promote healthy eating, cooking and food growing.

Healthy Choice Award This scheme assists restaurants, cafes, nurseries and care homes in making healthy options available on their menus and helps customers make healthier choices

Sticky Fingers Project We work with primary school children in East Brighton, taking a plot to plate approach in educating about food growing and cooking

**Lobbying and campaigning** We run campaigns at a local level and support national campaigns. We also sit on city-wide partnerships to promote the importance of a sustainable food system

In partnership with key agencies the Food Partnership developed Spade to Spoon Making the Connections, a food strategy and action plan for the city Community groups, departments within the Council and NHS Brighton & Hove, the waste sector, schools and others from across the city have signed up to delivering targets in the action plan The Food Partnership leads on local food work within the strategy as well as targets for healthier diets

#### REVIEW OF BUSINESS

During the financial year April 2010 to March 2011 the company's income and expenditure increased mainly due to activity on the Big Lottery funded Harvest Brighton & Hove project

The company employed 8 full time and 4 part time staff in this period and the work was supported by 50 volunteers

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements

#### Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

#### Cash Flow Statement

In accordance with Financial Reporting Standard Number 1, the company is exempt from the requirements to prepare a cash flow statement on account of its size

#### Income

Income takes the form of grants to provide specific services or towards general support of our costs, or payment in the form of a contract for services provided. Where grants and similar income are for time based projects, or have been paid in advance in any way, the appropriate amount of income has been carried forward within the deferred income account. Income will be credited to the income and expenditure account from the deferred income account in line with the associated relevant costs, or on a time basis, as is most appropriate.

#### Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Plant and Equipment – 33% on cost

#### Funds

The company has various types of funds for which it is responsible

Unrestricted funds – these funds are for use on the general objectives of the company Restricted funds – these funds are for specific purposes as laid down by the donor – expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund together with a fair proportion of management and support costs

#### Pensions

The pension cost charge represents the contributions payable by the company to the employees' pension schemes
