TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, present their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2018.

Structure, governance and management

Via Design is a UK charitable company, limited by guarantee (company number 5658322). The company was incorporated on 19 December 2005. It was accepted for registration by the Charity Commission on 6 October 2006 (charity number 1116325). To comply with Charity Commission requirements for income received through trading, on 6 January 2006, Via Design (Trading) Limited (company number 5668136) was incorporated as a subsidiary, wholly owned by Via Design, with the aim of reinvesting all its profits to further the objects of Via Design.

Via Design was established for the purpose of advancing education and livelihood creation amongst disadvantaged people and communities to relieve poverty by providing opportunities for learning and employment; to advance health, especially through rehabilitation activities for those who are vulnerable; to advance the Christian faith, as stated in the statement of beliefs of Churches Together in England, especially through an understanding of the value of individuals and the good stewardship of resources.

The work of the charity is carried out by the Chief Executive, Janet Rogers, under the supervision of the trustees.

Objectives and activities

The objects of the charity are to empower disadvantaged and marginalised people and communities through facilitating sustainable business development, including training in design, crafts and production skills.

Key objectives for the year were to provide consultancy services to Freeset Business Incubator, in West Bengal in Murshidabad District, where girls are at risk of being trafficked into the sex trade and in red-light districts where women are trapped in prostitution. The first Murshidabad freedom business, Freeset Fabrics, which started with 7 trainees in October 2014, was providing training and employment for 49 beneficiaries by 31 December 2018.

Objectives and activities, continued

The charity carries out some of its activities through its trading subsidiary, Via Design (Trading) Limited, which was set up to develop a market for the products generated by the charity's development activities. In 2018, a new product incorporating fabric from Freeset was stitched at Flowering Desert. Via shared a stand with Tabitha Living and Social Business at a UK commercial retail event in April to raise awareness about freedom business.

The trustees use their discretion to make grants and donations and to undertake social investment. The provision of a grant towards the extension and fitting out of the Flowering Desert freedom business unit in Tamil Nadu (which Via has been supporting since it was founded) approved last year was made in February 2018. A further donation was used to purchase equipment for the Freeset business unit that Via is particularly involved with in Murshidabad, West Bengal and presented on International Women's Day in March 2018.

As with previous years, Via places volunteers with relevant experience who share the vision to see vulnerable people empowered through business and livelihood development. Goals for 2018 included expanding the impact of Via Design so more lives are transformed through business. Erika Hegenberg, a product designer, was appointed through Via Design to work across all the Freeset businesses in Kolkata and Murshidabad to provide training and guidance with product development. Janet Rogers continued to serve as Chief Executive.

Public benefit

The trustees, in planning and carrying out the activities of Via Design, have taken account of the Charity Commission's guidance on providing public benefit. They are satisfied with the extent of Via's public benefit over the year and believe that these benefits are in keeping with Via's charitable objects. At Flowering Desert in Tamil Nadu, through connections and ongoing input from Via Design, 40+ women were regularly employed in 2018, supplying key clients introduced by Via Design. At 31 December 2018, at Freeset Fabrics there were 49 beneficiaries. No new trainees were taken on because of overall restructuring of Freeset to enable future growth. Existing Freeset employees continued to receive management and leadership training providing opportunity for career development. This training and employment opportunity has had a positive impact on families and communities and there is evidence to support this.

As in previous years of operation, the role and contribution of volunteers has enabled the work of Via Design to be carried out and represents a significant saving in operational costs. It has also continued to allow volunteers an experience that cannot be quantified financially.

Achievements and performance

Via continues to see its main achievement as having established a good framework for operating and communicating with project partners and suppliers in India, with attention given to reviewing and evaluating feasibility and research phases as well as outcomes from projects and workshops. As in previous years, this process has helped the trustees in making decisions affecting the nature or timing of any potential collaboration. Below is a summary of impact through Via activities and public impact and benefit.

In India, Via focused most of its operations in West Bengal, working with the Freeset Business Incubator team with freedom businesses in communities where women and girls are vulnerable to being trafficked. This was aimed at making the widest possible public benefit. Women now have more confidence and awareness of

their rights as well as skills which impact significantly on the livelihood for themselves and their immediate families. Via contributed to the Cup, a Community café established by Freeset Trust, by working with local potters to design and commission pottery cups for use in the café. Via also designed and delivered creative/craft workshops as part of activities offered by Freeset Trust.

During the year, Via continued to work with Flowering Desert in Tamil Nadu, providing voluntary advice and consultancy, and nurturing the relationship with a new UK client, working with both parties to facilitate product development, sustainable production and timely delivery. In the UK, Via made several awareness-raising presentations and carried out market research on behalf of Freeset and Flowering Desert which provide support and alternative employment for vulnerable women, including those wishing to exit the sex trade. A scholarship was awarded to the Chief Executive by Thomson Reuters to attend the Trust Conference in Westminster in November 2018 which focused on ending modern slavery, and human rights.

In the UK, similar creative activities as those developed by Via in India were explored with Tamar, a UK organisation within All Souls Church, a UK charity, ready for delivery in 2019/20.

Because of the focus on consultancy and support for the two main beneficiaries in India and the development of more community activities in India and the UK, Via's trading activities remained low, with plans to promote existing and new products, and secure new routes to market in 2019/20.

A grant of £10,000 made in 2016, plus an additional donation of £1,000 was held within a larger project fund as matching funds for a grant from the New Zealand Government (MFAT). The grant was transferred in early January 2016, as restricted funds, for use in the Freeset Business Incubator programme. Creative workshops during 2018/19 for women at Freeset Trust's Community café (established August 2018) and with Tamar in the UK were positively received by beneficiaries.

Volunteers and supporters continued to fundraise for the charity as well as for their own support.

Financial review

Income for the year was £1,499. This was from regular or one-off donations. Expenditure was £3,474, leaving an overall deficit of £1,975. The charity had unrestricted funds of £2,019 to carry forward at 31 December 2018.

The trading subsidiary made sales of £700 during the year. A profit of £86 was realised.

The charity as it develops its work is being supported by the Chief Executive, Janet Rogers, and by other interested parties or organisations. A loan of £25,446 to the trading company is not repayable before 1 January 2020 and will only be repaid when sufficient funds are available. No reserves are being maintained currently. However, this will be reviewed by the trustees.

Plans for future periods

Via will continue to work closely in partnership with its beneficiaries: Freeset, Freeset Business Incubator, Mahalir Aran Trust, Flowering Desert. Since restructuring of Freeset is underway, the focus of Via and, in

particular, the role of the Chief Executive, has been reviewed. Current work involves less operational responsibility for Freeset and provides strategic and spiritual support to those working in ethical businesses. With longer periods working in the UK, Via will continue developing relationships within UK organisations and local community groups, especially in Westminster and in Reading, where the same issues of trafficking and modern slavery are found.

The trustees would like to sincerely thank all those who have provided support towards the work of Via during its 13th year of operation, whether through gifts in kind, voluntary service, advice or donations. Without this valuable support and encouragement, Via would not have been able to see such a positive impact on the lives of the beneficiaries it seeks to empower.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity, and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the provisions of 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice' applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 (Charities SORP FRS 102), and the Companies Act 2006.

The trustees are confident that sufficient resources will become available to enable the charity to meet its liabilities as they become due for the twelve months following approval of these accounts and the accounts are accordingly prepared on the going concern basis.

Consolidation

In the opinion of the trustees, the company and its subsidiary undertaking comprise a small group. The company has therefore taken advantage of the exemption provided by Section 398 of the Charities Act 2011 not to prepare group accounts. The trustees do not consider the cost of preparing consolidated accounts justifiable and note 9 provides adequate details relating to the nature of the trading subsidiary.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subject to restrictions on their expenditure specified by the donor or through the terms of fundraising initiatives.

Income

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to specific categories of income.

Voluntary income received by way of grants, donations and gifts is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.

Gifts in kind are accounted for at a reasonable estimate of their value to the charity and are included in the Statement of Financial Activities as incoming resources when receivable.

Donated services and facilities are only included in incoming resources (with an equivalent amount in resources expended) where the benefit to the charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material. The value placed on these resources is the estimated value to the charity of the service or facility received.

Any investment income is included when receivable.

Income, continued

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the Statement of Financial Activities at the same time as the gifts to which they relate.

The value of any volunteer help received is not included in the accounts.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure including any VAT which cannot be fully recovered is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income from trusts, churches, and individuals.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in preparation and delivery of its programme. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the independent reporting accountant's fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to funds on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write off assets over their estimated useful lives:

Plant and equipment - 25% on reducing balance

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit.
