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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JANUARY 2016

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 January 2016. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the charity are to provide relief of any charitable need and in particular the relief of poverty, the alleviation of illness and the advancement of education in Africa.

Significant activities

Love Is All We Need currently helps support the Hope Centre in Pietermaritzburg, South Africa. The centre houses over 40 orphans aged from 4 to 14 years of age. The funding providing goes towards the day to day running costs of The Hope Centre including food, repairs, school uniforms, school fees and funding for external activities and trips. Due to cut back in funding from other sources The Hope Centre is no longer providing outreach work into the Sweetwaters Community.

Towards the end of the year we started to support another outreach project run by one of the former carer at The Hope Centre. As well as doing outreach work this project is also housing 16 teenage girls from the community and we are providing funding here for basic supplies such as food, clothing and school fees. The new project is growing and there are a team of 5 ladies from the community working together to support child headed households and members of the community suffering from HIV/AIDS.

New projects being undertaken in 2016/17 include funding provided to Mama Ntombi's Community Projects to facilitate a new program of play therapy for children who have suffered trauma. Again we are pleased to be supporting this project as it is led by a former carer at The Hope Centre.

Public benefit

In planning our activities for the year we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at our trustee meetings. The focus of our activities remains creating futures for abandoned children in the Sweetwaters area.

The activities currently carried out for the public benefit by the charity can be broadly categorised into the following areas: public health, which includes nutrition, clothing, shelter and accommodation. We also promote sustainability, through the provision of education and training.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

In the last year of operation we have sent £8,356 to help support the Hope Centre and other community projects. At the end of the year we had 52 people regularly giving money to Love Is All We Need every month. Two of these are corporate givers. We earned £11,389 in the year from Regular Giving and we held the 10th annual Hair 4 Love event which raised over £5,000. Our Chairperson visited The Hope Centre in February 2016.

The charity's bank account has never been in deficit. This is because we have kept our annual running costs to approximately £1,500 or less. We have been able to do this by: a) sourcing over 20 volunteers, who have supported us b) leveraging a high level of in-kind donations c) running events that require minimal investment.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The trustees have agreed to maintain a small reserve to cover the running costs of the charity for at least 12 months and at the year end this reserve contained £2,000. We also have put in place an emergency fund and a property fund so that we are in a position to support the Hope Centre and find suitable temporary accommodation for the children should that become necessary, at the year-end these funds held £13,000. All money coming in from regular giving goes into the regular giving fund which is guaranteed to be used only for donations to the beneficiaries. At the year end the regular giving fund balance was £4,521.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JANUARY 2016

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Charity constitution

The organisation adopted a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the Charity and is governed under its Articles of Association. Every member of the Charity undertakes to contribute such amount as may be required, not exceeding £10, to the Charity's assets if it should be wound up while he or she is a member or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member, for payment of the Charity's debts and liabilities contracted before he or she ceases to be a member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories amount themselves.

Induction and training of new trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association the members of the Management Committee are elected to serve at the Annual General Meeting. No person shall be admitted a member of the Charity unless his application for membership is approved by the trustees. Unless the trustees of the Charity in general meeting shall make other provision under Article 61 in the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the trustees may in their absolute discretion permit any member of the Charity to retire, provided that after such retirement the number of members is not less than two. Each year one third of the Management Committee must retire from the committee, if they wish to continue to serve they can offer themselves for re-election.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JANUARY 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRSSE) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective I January 2015)', the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
