Qualified opinion arising from disagreement over accounting treatment

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year and the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles which are generally accepted in the United Kingdom ("UK GAAP")

Investment properties totalling £2,040,020 are included in the financial statements at an external valuation that was carried out as at 1 July 2005. This is not in accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No 19 which requires investment properties to be revalued annually and included in the balance sheet at their open market value at the balance sheet date. We have been unable to quantify the effect on reserves and tangible fixed assets of this non-compliance.

Except for the effect of the issue referred to in the preceding paragraph, in our opinion the financial statements

- give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 May 2010 and of its profit for the year then ended,
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice, and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006

Opinion on other matter prescribed by the Companies Act 2006

In our opinion the information given in the Directors' Report for the financial year for which the financial statements are prepared is consistent with the financial statements

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of land and buildings and applicable accounting standards

Going Concern

An undertaking has been received from C A Holdings Plc, the company's parent company that it will provide the necessary financial support to enable the company to continue in operational existence and meet its liabilities as they fall due for the foreseeable future being a period of at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements

In addition, a further undertaking has been provided by Cannon Automotive Limited, a fellow group company, that it will not seek repayment of any amounts owed by the company for a period of at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements

On the basis of these undertakings the directors have concluded that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis

Cash Flow Statement

The company has taken advantage of the small company exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS1

Fixed assets

The cost of tangible fixed assets is their purchase cost, together with any incidental expenses of acquisition

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets other than investment properties, at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition, of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows

Plant and equipment fixtures and fittings

15% straight line

Computer equipment

- 25% straight line

Turnover

Turnover represents rents and other property income receivable for the year, net of Value Added Tax

Investment Properties

United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ('UK GAAP") requires investment properties to be included in the balance sheet at open market value. The directors do not believe that it is appropriate to instruct an external valuer to value these properties as at 31 May 2010 as the cost would outweigh any benefit. In addition, the directors have no intention of selling the properties in the current market and therefore believe that it is appropriate for them to be valued as at 31 May 2010 on the basis of an internal directors' valuation.

This internal directors valuation is based on the last external professional valuation which was carried out as at 1 July 2005 and which does not therefore comply with UK GAAP

Acquisitions and disposals of investment properties are recognised in the financial statements upon completion of the purchase or sale contract
