1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

1.2 Changes in accounting policies

The company has adopted the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities during the year as the directors feel that this standard is more appropriate to the circumstances of the company. The adoption of this standard represents a change in accounting policy and the comparative figures do not require restatement. There is no prior year adjustment to reserves resulting from adopting this standard, as the provisions relevant to this company relate to disclosure only.

1.3 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated).

1.4 Turnover

Turnover represents gross rental income and revenue from the sale of development properties.

The company has therefore taken advantage of the exemptions provided by section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 not to prepare group accounts.
