The company made no political or charitable donations or incurred any political expenditure during the year (2012: £Nil).

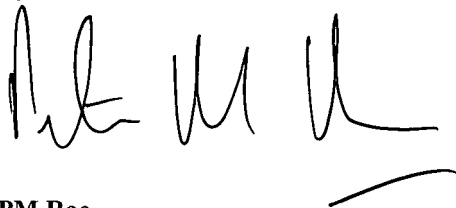
Disclosure of information to auditors

Statement of directors' responsibilities in respect of the directors' report and the financial statements

The directors are responsible for preparing the directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

They have general responsibility for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the assets of the company and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.

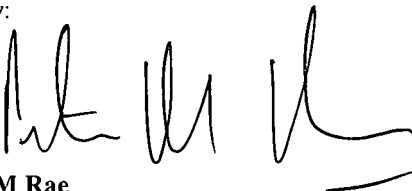
During the current year and preceding financial year, the company received no income and incurred no expenditure. Consequently, during these years, the company made neither a profit nor a loss.

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements:

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom and under the historical cost accounting convention.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, in view of the fact that Synectics plc has formally indicated that it will provide sufficient funding to the Company to enable it to meet its liabilities as they fall due, for at least the next twelve months from the date of these financial statements.

Under Financial Reporting Standard 1, the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that Synectics plc includes the company in its own published consolidated financial statements.

As the company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Synectics plc, the company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has, therefore, not disclosed transactions or balances with entities which form part of the group.

The consolidated financial statements of Synectics plc, within which the company is included, may be obtained from the address given in note 6.

2 Directors' emoluments

3 Audit fees
