### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### **CONSTITUTION**

North East Equality and Diversity Limited is constituted as a registered charity and a company under guarantee in accordance with its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 16 May 2006 and last amended 25 March 2010.

### APPOINTMENT, INDUCTION AND TRAINING OF TRUSTEES

New trustees undergo an induction process to brief them on their legal obligations under charity and company law, the content of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the committee and decision making processes, the business plan and recent financial performance of the charity. Trustees are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events.

### ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND DECISION MAKING

Day to day management is vested in a professional team led by the Chief Executive of the charity, who meets with the board on a six weekly basis. The Chief Executive meets regularly with the Chair (in addition to the formal meetings) and appraises him of any significant issues as they may arise between meetings.

### **RISK POLICY**

The trustees are responsible for assessing the major risks to which the charitable company is exposed, and for establishing systems to mitigate those risks, they have considered risks which could have a negative effect on the charitable company's ability to pursue its aims, both in terms of the likelihood of these occuring and the probable impact of such events. The trustees continue to review and monitor these risks, and the adequacy of the systems in place to reduce them.

HSBC continues to provide satisfactory banking services and a good relationship exists with their local manager.

#### TRADING ARM

Vetra Limited is the charitable company's trading subsidiary. The company ceased to trade during the year ended 31st August 2012. After discharging all liabilities in the year ended 31st August 2013 it has remained dormant.

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The object of the charitable company is:

- To provide a community transport service for inhabitants of North East England and border region
  who are in need of these services because of age, sickness or disability (mental or physical), or
  poverty, or because of a lack of availability of adequate and safe passenger public services.
- The promotion of equality and diversity for the public benefit in the North East of England and the Borders Region by:
  - a) advancing education and raising awareness in equality and diversity
  - b) promoting activities to foster understanding between people from diverse backgrounds
  - c) providing comprehensive advice and support through giving advice, representation, and advocacy

### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

### **Chief Executives Officers Report**

NEED is recognised for providing excellent services to our users. This is undoubtedly due to the dedication of our Board of Directors (Trustees), staff and volunteers.

This year has been tinged with sadness as Andrew Davidson our General Manager passed away suddenly in May in Newcastle whilst undertaking business for NEED, suffice to say it was a huge shock for everyone. We are only just starting to come to terms with his passing and he will be sadly missed not only as a colleague and senior figure within the organisation, but also as a friend.

In our last financial year (September 2014 to August 2015) we secured a six month winter measures contract with the North East Ambulance Service (NEAS) worth £225,000 to operate a 2x 2 man crews 7 days a week. This financial year (2015-16) due to budget cuts NEAS operated an adhoc service only for winter measures, inevitably there was a knock on effect with NEED which is reflected in this years' lower turnover and surplus.

However, on a brighter note in August this year Northumberland County Council awarded NEED 15 new Home to School contracts with a start date of 6th September 2016, thus ensuring that NEED will start the new financial year in a very positive position with a total of 18 Home to School contracts.

Our 'Secure Transport', and 'Ferndene' (young people's mental health unit) contract for Northumberland, Tyne and Wear NHS Foundation Trust have also been extended until May 2017 with the option of a further 12 month extension.

I would like to welcome our new Training Officer Peter Lawrence to NEED. Peter has a wealth of experience in the training field and has already written new courses alongside our previous ones and has ensured that all of the courses are accredited with the Open College Network (OCN).

With the help of Karen Wood (CEO for North East Social Enterprise Partnership) and Andrew Wilson (BE Group) NEED was awarded £23,880 from Big Potential to help NEED become social investment ready which may prove useful when we want to purchase new premises.

NEED is 100% fully sustainable due to contract work and therefore is not reliant on grant funding for the core costs of the organisation. The income generated from tendered contracts is re-invested in NEED enabling the expansion of our services within local communities. This takes the form of group and individual accessible transport.

The new fire station being built on Lionheart Industrial Estate is due to be completed by March 2017 therefore we are still searching for a new home with some urgency. MP Anne Marie Trevelyan has given her support and has been contacting various bodies on our behalf.

I would formally like to thank all NEED staff, volunteers and Board Members for their commitment to the organisation.

### **Review of 2015-2016**

This has been a challenging year for NEED due to the untimely death of Andrew Davidson a long serving senior member of staff.

Andrew was the General Manager and as such was responsible the day to day running of NEED, and although sadly missed, staff have supported each other and have undertaken extra tasks to ensure that NEED can maintain momentum and focus on moving forward.

- NEED has achieved the following during 2015-2016:
- Transportation of 35,868 passengers over 230,0225 miles (down slightly on last year mainly due to adhoc only Winter Measures for the North East Ambulance Service.)
- ISO 9001:2008 continued accreditation
- Extension of Secure Transport contract
- Extension of Ferndene Contract
- Expansion of NEED a Car Scheme
- Extension of Dial-A-Ride service
- Renewal of transport service with Elpha Lodge, Hadston
- Training has expanded due to having a dedicated training officer. First Aid and MiDAS are the most popular courses. All of our courses are accredited through the Open College Network (OCN). A full list of courses can be obtained from the office
- Award of £23,880 from Big Potential (Big Lottery and Social Investment Business) to enable NEED work in partnership with NESEP (North East Social Enterprise Partnership) and BE Group in help NEED become social investment ready allowing
- Continued provision of Dialysis and Patient Transport with adhoc Urgent Care Transport for North East Ambulance Service NHS Trust covering Northumberland, North Tyneside, South Tyneside and North Durham.

#### **Vehicles**

At the end of this financial year NEED owns 15 vehicles consisting of 10 minibuses and 5 Multi Purpose Vehicles (MPV's) 2 minibuses were sold and 2 bought, a new MPV has been ordered and will be delivered in early September.

#### Dial-a-Ride Service

A door to door accessible minibus service continues to be provided every Monday from Alwinton to Morpeth. It enables those with mobility issues access to fresh food outlets in Morpeth. This is a contracted service with Northumberland County Council (NCC). NEED are discussing further DAR services in partnership with NCC for our next financial year.

### **Group Hire**

There are 47 groups who use this service on a regular basis, they vary from small unconstituted groups, to voluntary and statutory organisations. A driver and/or passenger assistant can be provided or the hirer can use their own driver as long as the individual has been trained in MIDAS (Minibus Drivers Awareness Scheme) and have a valid license with the relevant categories.

#### Individual Hire

NEED offers the hire of small accessible Multi Purpose Vehicles with or without a driver for those who wish to travel alone or with a small group of up to 6 friends.

#### Trained Staff

NEED are able to supply driver and passenger assistant services with or without vehicles.

### Community

The main charitable aim of NEED is to provide transport to the most vulnerable members of the community as stated above. To this end our community work takes the form of "door to door" Dial-a-Ride services, Need a Car Scheme - transporting individuals to fresh food outlets, health appointments, and social events etc, group transport i.e. transporting 4 to 16 people, provision of transport for youth groups, delivering meals to day centres 3 x per week.

### FINANCIAL REVIEW

The financial position for the year shows an overall deficit of expenditure over income of £10,006. At the year-end unrestricted funds were £98,144 and restricted funds were £11,430. The financial statements, which have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2015), conform to current statutory requirements and comply with the charity's governing documents.

### RESERVES POLICY

It is the policy of the organisation to maintain unrestricted funds, which are free reserves of the charitable company, at a level not exceeding approximately three months unrestricted expenditure of the core service. This would equate to approximately £100,000 based on current levels of expenditure. At the year-end unrestricted free reserves amounted to £35,131.

### **PUBLIC BENEFIT**

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities. In particular, the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

### PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The Strategic plan will continue to undergo fundamental reviews, amendments are in hand that include staffing structures, fuel costs, vehicle maintenance costs as well as the diversification and concentration of resources into new areas of work. The Strategic plan is a working document in order to ensure sustainability and is consistent with the future needs of the business.

New contracts are to be tendered for within the remit of the charitable aims or via the trading arm Vetra...

NEED trustees and senior staff are actively searching for suitable new premises in the anticipation that the present Fire Station in Alnwick will be relocated by early 2017.

To continue to work closely with all of our partners.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### **YEAR ENDED 31st AUGUST 2016**

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets and investments measured at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015), and the requirements of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) (SORP 2015).

### **Incoming resources**

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charitable company is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants and donations and is included in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charitable company, are recognised when the charitable company becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant. Grants received where conditions specified by the donor have not yet been met by the charitable company, or where the donor has specified the time period in which the expenditure of resources can take place, are deferred and recognised once all conditions have been met, or over the time period specified by the donor.

Incoming resources from charitable activities is contract income with local authorities and other similar services income and is recognised on the basis of work done.

### Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charitable company and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors which have been raised by the charitable company for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund in set out in the notes to the financial statements. Where fixed assets are acquired using restricted funds, on aquistion of assets, if there are no ongoing restrictions as to the use of the asset, then the asset is released to unrestricted funds on the balance sheet.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

### Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the activities of the charitable company. Governance costs are those incurred in connection with compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Management and administration staff spend time directly on charitable, fund-raising and governance activities. Central wages and salaries are apportioned to these activities on the basis of estimated time spent by support staff directly on those activities each month.

#### Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:
