Report of the directors for the year ended 30 June 2012

The directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2012

Results and dividends

The profit and loss account is set out on page 6 and shows the loss for the year. The directors do not recommend payment of a dividend (2011 £Nil)

Principal activity

The Company's principal activity is that of a developer in the regeneration of the area surrounding The Den, the football stadium of Millwall Football Club (the "Club")

Prospects

The Company was delighted to note that outline planning permission has been granted for the regeneration of the Surrey Canal Site (which includes both The Den and the adjacent Lion's Centre) and is proud to have played a significant part in the successful application. It looks forward to presenting its plans for the improvement of visitor amenities on both match and non-match days and the comprehensive redevelopment of the Lion's Centre. The importance of the Club and its community scheme were rightly recognised in Lewisham Council's core strategy document and the Company looks forward to the latter's support as it takes a leading role in the regeneration of the Surrey Canal Site.

In this context the Company is gravely concerned by Lewisham's Council's decision to offer the site of the Lion's Centre to property developers when it is (and has for a long time been) well aware of the Company's long-held ambition to redevelop the Lion's Centre for the long-term benefit of both the Club and the Millwall Community Scheme Lewisham Council owns the freehold to both The Den and the Lion's Centre and, as such, the Company looks for its whole-hearted support both now and in the future as the Company finalises its exciting plans for these sites within the overall regeneration scheme

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The directors believe it is appropriate to prepare the accounts on this basis as they have obtained confirmation that the immediate parent undertaking intends to continue to support the Company for the foreseeable future. In forming this opinion the Board has given consideration to the loan facilities currently available to the immediate parent undertaking and cash flow projections for a period of not less than twelve months from the date of signing these accounts.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards

Going concern

The directors continually monitor the financial position of the Company, taking into account the latest cash flow forecasts and the ability of the Company to generate cash. The directors have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis having had regard to cash flow projections for a period of not less than twelve months from the date of signing these accounts, which includes funding from the immediate parent company

While there will always remain some inherent uncertainty the directors remain confident that they will be able to manage the Company's finances and operations so as to achieve the forecasted cash flows and, as a result, that it is appropriate to draw up the financial statements on a going concern basis

The financial statements do not include any adjustments that would result if the going concern basis of preparation were to become no longer appropriate

Taxation

Corporation tax payable is provided on taxable profits at the current rate

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date except that the recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that the Company anticipates to make sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing differences

Deferred tax balances are not discounted

Cash flow statement

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised) not to prepare a cash flow statement, on the basis that the Company and its cash flows are consolidated in the financial statements of its immediate parent company
